FROM THE PASTOR'S PEN

PENTECOST

For fifty days we have been celebrating the resurrection of Jesus Christ. Now the Easter season culminates in the grand celebration of Pentecost.

The original Pentecost propelled the disciples into an apostleship. In Greek, *apostolos* literally means "one who is sent."

In the New Testament, "apostle" has three broad meanings. The first refers to the Twelve whom Jesus chose to train for the tasks of carrying on his mission and message in the world. After his resurrection, Jesus commissioned them for this task.

The second meaning of the term designates a person authorized by a local Christian community to deliver safely specific gifts to another community. The third sense of the term "apostle" refers to any person sent by Jesus Christ for his work in the world.

This third sense applies to us. We are sent by Christ to continue his mission in this day and age.

That's why the celebration of Pentecost is not just some memorial of a long-ago event. The descent of the Holy Spirit is something for which we pray today, that we might be empowered to act on behalf of Christ in the world.

Lest this thought of acting on behalf of Christ in the world frighten you, remember our witness to Jesus:

- is not necessarily a big, dramatic thing it can be quiet and subtle;
- can be done close to home;
- shouldn't always be done alone or as individuals, as more often than not, we are called to act together as disciples sent by Jesus;
- •doesn't require someone completely versed in Scripture or a theologian; it requires good hearted believers who know Jesus in their own lives as Lord and Savior.

We modern-day disciples are privileged to be tasked with serving the kingdom of God here and now. To do that, we need to be open to the promptings of the Holy Spirit.

Happy Pentecost!






DAILY MASS TIME CHANGE FOR WEDNESDAY MORNINGS

A LOOK AT HUNGER, JUST 7.5 MILES AWAY

Each month, multiple Divine Mercy parishioners volunteer at the Rogers Park non-profit community kitchen A Just Harvest. They help distribute food to area residents, transport donations of bread, deliver Uncle Pete's sack dinners made once a month by Divine Mercy volunteers, and bring non-perishable food donations.



On a recent visit to A Just Harvest, Director of Food Services David Crawford shared that he is seeing an upswing in need. The donations provided by Divine Mercy Parish are increasingly important to their operations.

Ninety percent of the non-perishable food pantry items A Just Harvest receives go out each week. The bread delivered weekly by Divine Mercy volunteers goes out quickly, as does the produce they receive through other sources.

David further described the population they serve. They currently have 10 families with 6+ members. They are feeding 140 people each week from a nearby social service agency, and the shelter across the street recently closed so they have about 100 people from there they are feeding. That is in addition to those who simply walk up and request help.

In addition, A Just Harvest volunteers make upwards of 120 deliveries per week. He reports that they are also receiving an increase in calls from the City's emergency services looking for help for people with no food. This overwhelming demand is why efforts like Uncle Pete's Ministry are vitally important to A Just Harvest.

This (story) comes from Venerable Fulton Sheen. You can read full versions of the story here.

The Chinese government has never been fond of Christians. During the Boxer Rebellion, they sent soldiers to destroy Catholic Churches. A little girl was praying in the back of one of these Churches when the soldiers came. They desecrated the church and arrested the priest. Finally, they broke into the tabernacle and threw the Eucharist all over the floor. There were 32 hosts.

The priest was placed under house arrest in the rectory. That night, he watched as the little girl slipped past the solider outside the rectory and sneaked into the Church. She knelt before one of the hosts on the floor, and made a holy hour. Then she bent down and consumed the Eucharist by licking Him off the floor.

She did this every night for 32 nights. On the 32nd night, after she had consumed the final host, she accidentally made a small noise. It was enough to wake up the rectory guard. The priest watched from his bedroomcum-prison as the guard martyred the little girl by beating her to death with the butt of his rifle.

We don't know her name. We don't know anything about her, other than that we should all pray to be more like her. Her story is so beautiful that it spread from person to person, then town to town, and eventually made its way to a young priest named Fr. Fulton Sheen. He was so inspired by it that he committed himself to making a daily Holy Hour. He later became a bishop and a very popular radio and television preacher (you may have heard). His cause for canonization is currently open, and just had a new miracle approved in March.

However, despite his enormous success, he told an interviewer shortly before his death that this little girl inspired his work more than any Pope or canonized saint. She kindled a Eucharistic love in him that fed his whole ministry. And that's why he was able to say one of the most beautiful quotes of all time ever:

"THE GREATEST LOVE STORY OF ALL TIME IS CONTAINED IN A TINY WHITE HOST."

I love to think about that little girl when I'm in front of the Eucharist. I ask her to help me pay attention, and to love our Eucharistic Lord the way she did. And then sometimes I think about Venerable Fulton Sheen's quote. Am I here to fall in love, or to look holy? And am I trying to write the story, or am I letting Him tell it to me?

Climbing food prices drained the 32-year old woodcutter's savings, and his family sold their truck. Hunger began to gnaw at their bellies, and they pawned off their gold. Then, after war erupted thousands of miles away in Ukraine, diesel grew more and more scarce in Sri Lanka, leading to daily power cuts starting last month. Now, Peiris has been forced to scale back his lumber shipments - and his diet. What money he has goes to buying eggs for his pregnant wife.

"I can't remember the last time I ate chicken or coconut milk," Peiris said, sitting inside his half-finished house while his five employees idly sorted matchwood in the yard. It was another afternoon wasted, with no electricity or diesel to power his tools and make a living. "I'm afraid," he said. "I don't know how to continue."

Sri Lanka is mired in an unprecedented economic crisis brought on by mostly domestic factors: Years of foreign-debt-fueled government spending, badly timed tax cuts, policies that hurt crop yields and a precipitous drop in tourism during the coronavirus pandemic have hollowed out its foreign reserves. But Sri Lanka's teetering finances were dealt another blow this year when war in Europe sent global

fuel and food prices surging, turning the small country's uphill economic struggle into something insurmountable."
