

GOOD NEWS!

Our parish has been searching for quite some time now for a Director of Evangelization and Life Long Formation, ever since our former director, Sue Lehocky, moved on from Divine Mercy in order to work at the Archdiocesan level. I am very pleased to report to you that our search for a new director has concluded successfully.

Patty Sanfilippo will assume this vital staff position beginning tomorrow, Monday, July 11. After interviewing many qualified candidates, the search team concluded, once Patty put her own hat in the ring, so to speak, that she was the one most qualified to be the new director.

This is not the first time that a parish has hired a person from within the parish to engage in ministry. Patty brings with her to this role a wide range of experience in hands-on ministry in this faith community. She has been involved in multiple efforts in the parish, from greeting people before Mass, to personally welcoming newcomers to Divine Mercy with a one-on-one "welcome wagon" approach, to being a catechist in children's ministry, to involvement in all of the in-person and on-line Alpha courses, to membership on our parish evangelization board, to always lending a helping hand at special events, to membership on the Parish Council (spending the last two years with others on the council crafting the five-year strategic plan), to even being a "driver" for our recent mission visitor, Fr. Alphonse, returning him to his residency at St. Josephat's parish (he doesn't drive).

The Director of Evangelization and Life Long Formation is a full-time position and is crucial to the renewal efforts which we are pursuing at Divine Mercy Parish. Patty's ministerial experience and commitment to our parish augers well for our future as we continue to

make disciples, build Church and serve others. Welcome aboard, Patty!

As I announce this good news to you, I would also like to take the opportunity to thank the search team in its efforts and the many meetings that they attended to bring us to this point.

I would also like to thank staff member Liz McGowen, our Director of Pastoral Care, Outreach and Special Events for overseeing Alpha during the lengthy search process. Liz took on this added responsibility cheerfully, willingly and to great good effect.

At the same time, staff member Judy Pyke oversaw the fledgling after-Alpha and adult formation programming, something that Patty will now grow and deepen. It's not like Liz and Judy had nothing on their plate previous to shouldering these additional burdens. Thanks to both of them!

As Patty begins work here, Liz will collaborate with Patty on Alpha, given that Alpha figures prominently in the first year of the Pastoral Council's five-year strategic plan for the parish. In fact, it's going to take the collaboration of many on our parish staff and many of our lay leaders to ramp up our evangelization efforts through Alpha.

Statement of Cardinal Cupich on the July 4 mass shooting in Highland Park

I have been watching the news in horror as at least 6 are dead and many more were wounded after a gunman opened fire as families attended an Independence Day parade in Highland Park. What should have been a peaceful celebration of our nation's founding ended in unspeakable tragedy.

Please join me in praying for the victims and their loved ones, who never imagined a July 4 celebration could become a killing ground. Pray too for the safety of first responders as they pursue the person responsible for this tragedy. They bravely rushed into the danger to treat victims and to protect others from harm.

The parade reportedly had a heavy presence of police and fire vehicles, yet this shooter was able to wound at least two dozen people before he stopped, or was stopped, and fled. Victims ranged in age from 8 to 85. Weapons designed to rapidly destroy human bodies have no place in civil society.

It is barely July, and this year the United States is already experiencing more than one mass shooting a day. Chicago Police reported at least 55 shot and 7 killed since Friday, and the holiday weekend is not yet over. Gun violence is now the leading cause of death for U.S. children.

Whatever one makes of the right to bear arms, there is plenty of room for prudential judgment in interpreting the Second Amendment so as to enact serious, broadly popular gun-safety measures. The Senate finally passed a significant, yet modest, gun-safety bill last month. But clearly more must be done.

The right to bear arms does not eclipse the right to life, or the right of all Americans to go about their lives free of the fear that they might be shredded by bullets at any moment. Gun violence is a life issue. We must continue to pray that all our officials, elected and unelected alike, will redouble their commitment to keeping safe the people they have sworn to serve.

Pope Francis wrote to the people of Chicagoland in 2016: "As Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. said, humanity 'must evolve for all human conflict a method which rejects revenge, aggression and retaliation. The foundation of such a method is love.' I urge all people, especially young men and women, to respond to Dr. King's prophetic words and know that a culture of nonviolence is not an unattainable dream, but a path that has produced decisive results."

May the Lord of mercy embrace in love those who have died, bring healing to the wounded, comfort to their loved ones, and courage to all of us, so that we may respond to this tragedy united as God's children to build a path to safety and peace.

A LITTLE HISTORY OF WHAT WE'VE ACCOMPLISHED SO FAR THIS YEAR

Our parish began making Uncle Pete's sack dinners in April 2022. In just four months this ministry has created a sense of community among volunteers while making 1,000 meals to feed the hungry. Although there are many places to distribute food, the Divine Mercy Outreach Board decided to focus on helping one of our existing community partners: A Just Harvest. This community kitchen in Rogers Park, just 7.5 miles from our parish, battles each and every day to feed the hungry.

A look back:

 On April 4, our first effort, all the supplies were purchased by the Uncle Pete's organization. Carolyn Murphy, the coordinator of the ministry, came to our first session to show us exactly what to do. We had 24 volunteers that first evening, and we made 300 sack dinners. A Just Harvest reported that the sack dinners were well received.

- For the second event, May 9, a generous donor offered to help us purchase items. Our efforts raised \$480.00, and the donor provided the balance we needed. Seventeen volunteers gathered and we made 300 sack dinners.
- After the May event, we discovered a couple of challenges. A Just Harvest's non-perishable food pantry was completely empty, so Divine Mercy parishioners leapt in to help and within a few days a large load of food went down to Rogers Park. The downside of this was that our monthly Hunger Hero food drive, with donations going to our local food pantries, was noticeably smaller. We wanted to find a solution so that our parish's support of A Just Harvest would not impact our parish's donations to our local food pantries.
- We also had a request from A Just Harvest to consider replacing the ham sandwiches with something else during hot summer months. After consultation with A Just Harvest and the Outreach Board, it was agreed that we would replace the sandwiches with tuna kits during June, July, and August, to make sure the contents of the sack dinners would be safe to eat despite high temperatures. This presented a challenge, since the tuna kits were a bit more expensive than the ham sandwiches. For the month of June, we let A Just Harvest know that we would provide 200 sandwich dinners, so that our costs would be



in line with the previous month. We had 27 volunteers in June.

Word about Uncle Pete's Ministry was spreading, however, and between our May and June dates we were blessed to raise more money than we needed to create the sack dinners. The question arose of what to do with the excess funds. In consultation with A Just Harvest and the Divine Mercy Outreach Board, it was decided that Divine Mercy would give A Just Harvest the excess money raised, so that they could purchase items for their food pantry through their vendors, thus purchasing at lower cost and without tax. On June 16th, we delivered a check for \$452.26 to A Just Harvest for their food pantry.

Thus, we've come a long way, and hope that you'll help us in the future as we continue to provide meals for the less fortunate.

ALTAR SERVER TRAINING

It is hard to believe that is has been over two years since our wonderful team of Altar Servers last served at Mass on a regular basis. We are most grateful that the students at Sacred Heart School have returned to serving at the Wednesday Morning Mass and a few other liturgies.

As we have done with all our ministries during the pandemic, we have strived to keep everyone as safe as possible. We have been close to bringing back our Sunday servers several times, only to see a spike in cases in our area. Now we are more hopeful that this summer is a good time to begin rebuilding this ministry in our parish. Will you help us?

We are looking for students who will be in grades 4 through high school during the 2022-2023 school year. (Exceptions will be made for same household members who are in third grade and have an older sibling participating at the same Mass). We are asking everyone to go through a training session, even if you have been trained before, as there may be some changes or updates since the last time we offered a training session. We want everyone to be on the same page as this ministry returns.

As we did prior to the pandemic, a parent will be required to attend the training with their child. Our next training session is July 17 at 11:15 a.m. at Sacred Heart Church. Those able to also serve at St. Philip the Apostle at the 8 a.m. Sunday Mass are also asked to come for this initial session at Sacred Heart Church. OUTREACH

A FEW WORDS FROM FATHER STEVE ON THE SITUATION IN UKRAINE

A few weeks back I preached about Aaron, a young person who got permission from his employers to take two weeks off from work in order to travel to Poland and help Ukrainian refugees. Aaron is the son of my best friend from high school, whom I've known all his life.

He has since returned from that humanitarian outreach but is currently planning on returning and continuing to help. One of the issues he discovered is the urgent need for battlefield medical kits to be used to stabilize those wounded by this war until such time as they can be sent out of the war zone for follow up treatment.

Hearing from my friend that his son has set up a GoFundMe account to raise money to purchase these kits, at my invitation Aaron is appealing to us for help. Aaron himself will travel with the kits he purchases and make sure they get to where they need to go.

This is definitely in line with one of the corporal works of mercy, healing the sick. Let's continue to pray for peace and do what we can to assist aid workers and volunteers addressing the needs of the Ukrainian people as they defend their country.

The following comes directly from Aaron Espenschied.

As the news cycle moves on, the War in Ukraine is no longer at the forefront but it is still a very real tragedy which has no end in sight. During my time spent over there in May, I learned that much of the money and supplies which other countries are donating are hitting roadblocks in reaching the troops on the front lines or the civilians caught in the crossfire due to logistical issues and the Russian onslaught. I plan on returning to Ukraine in a few weeks but



in the meantime, I am working to raise funds to purchase life-saving medical kits to take back with me. A description of those kits can be found on my Gofundme page.


Based on what I've learned from my interactions with those who fought on the eastern Ukrainian front, these kits are critical to keeping the wounded alive long enough to receive proper medical attention. I am currently working in conjunction with a Nonprofit, to deliver the medical kits to those on the front who need it most.

Regarding my personal relationship with Father Steve, I have known him pretty much all my life. He was my father's best friend in High School as well as the individual who baptized me. When my sister got married this past September he served as the officiant for the ceremony. I have seldom met a more caring or compassionate man. I also appreciate his sense of humor.


