

FROM THE PASTOR'S PEN

HEALING PRAYER

I was really heartened to see so many people come out for the interfaith prayer service in Glencoe as we prayed in remembrance and for healing in the wake of the July Fourth shootings in Highland Park. Glencoe and Highland Park villages cooperate in a variety of ways, and the Glencoe Clergy Association, of which we are members, wanted to host a prayer service to promote healing.

It was a beautiful and peaceful day. People listened, prayed along with us clergy and responded as we lifted our minds and hearts to God in worship, asking for inner healing for our spirits.

In Saint Paul's Letter to the Romans, we read, "Are you unaware that we who were baptized into Christ Jesus were baptized into his death? We were indeed buried with him through baptism into death, so that, just as Christ was raised from the dead by the glory of the Father, we too might live in newness of life" (Romans 6:3).

The hope we have of "newness of life" in Christ, the hope of life eternal, does

not necessarily lessen the loss we experience because of death, especially a violent, sudden death. I think of Dietrich Bonhoeffer's insight: "Nothing can make up for the absence of someone whom we love, and it would be wrong to try to find a substitute; we must simply hold out and see it through. That sounds very hard at first, but at the same time it is a great consolation, for the gap, as long as it remains unfilled, preserves the bonds between us. It is nonsense to say that God fills the gap; God doesn't fill it, but on the contrary, keeps it empty and so helps us to keep alive our former communion with each other, even at the cost of pain" (Letters and Papers From Prison, revised ed, Dietrich Bonnhoeffer, 1971, SCM Press, Ltd.).

The gap is there. But, even so, we pray, and in our prayers we find some measure of consolation and healing.





We continue to pray for those who lost their lives in Highland Park. May the Lord of love and mercy welcome them into paradise, and provide comfort to their grieving friends and family. We also pray for all those who were injured. May God bring healing to the wounded and comfort them in these difficult days.

UNCLE PETE'S: FEEDING THE HUNGRY

On the evening of Monday, July 11, 12 children helped out with our parish's Uncle Pete's Ministry sack making event. Joined by 21 adults, in about an hour, volunteers decorated sacks, filled them with food, and loaded 200 sack dinners into a van for delivery to A Just Harvest in Rogers Park.

Our parish strives to offer community building outreach events, but our commitment to help others is much more than just fun -- it is an important part of our Catholic faith. In just the last few months, volunteers from Divine Mercy Parish have tutored children, helped in food pantries, made 1,200 sack dinners, and participated in many more outreach activities. These activities focus on the issues Jesus speaks of in Matthew 25:35-36: "For I was hungry and you gave me food, I was thirsty and you gave me drink, a stranger and you welcomed me, naked and you clothed me, ill and you cared for me, in prison and you visited me."

If you would like to play a role in helping our parish feed the hungry, we are currently raising money for our next Uncle Pete's Ministry sack dinner making event on Monday, August 8. Donations will be used to purchase the items in the sack dinners, and excess funds raised go to A Just Harvest so they can purchase items for their food pantry.

PRAYER AND WORSHIP

AN ADORATION STORY FROM FR. JOHN PAUL GARDNER

Adoration of the Most Blessed Sacrament is happening more and more around our diocese and throughout United States, thanks be to God! How awesome it is to see faithful souls devoted to a weekly holy hour? Even so, unfortunately many Catholics still don't know what it is or what to do when they are in the presence of Jesus.

When I was about 12 years old I was much like most Catholics who don't understand the value of adoration. Real "tragedy" struck when on the first Friday of July that year my mother told me I had to spend an hour in adoration before I could go swimming at the community swimming pool.

I remember how distraught I was as I entered the church almost completely empty except for an old lady and a few of my fellow captives, I mean, my brothers and sisters. The first 10 minutes were the most painful. I was constantly thinking of the beautiful swimming pool I was not able to swim in, but instead, I was stuck at church.

Then my mind began to clear and I realized where I was, in the presence of almighty God. His presence revealed my selfishness. In fact, when I began to consider the fact that I was in the presence of His Divine Majesty, the whole church became, for me, like an amazing pool of grace. Believe me, I was extremely happy when the holy hour was up and I could dive into the swimming pool outside, but something in my heart changed forever. I realized there was an infinite amount of incredible, phenomenal, untold, mind-blowing graces available at the church every day.

Adoration of the Most Blessed Sacrament is a time we Catholics (or anyone with a prayerful heart) take to worship the true God in the person of Jesus Christ Who is really, truly present in the Eucharistic host.
Catholics usually make what is known as a holy hour to honor Jesus' heartfelt request to His closest disciples during His lonely agony in the garden, "Could you not spend one hour with me?"

Perhaps you've stayed for a few moments of adoration at your parish and then left, or maybe you pondered taking a holy hour each week, but, like me, you hesitated—thinking of all the other things you could be doing.

Here are some ideas about how to spend your time in adoration. First of all, don't worry about what you are to say, simply be in the presence of Jesus. That is pretty mindblowing stuff in and of itself.

Second, call to mind your sins or sufferings and ask Jesus to have mercy on you. Great healing is available to those who come to adoration.

Third, are you thankful for anything? Think of each person or thing in your life you are thankful for and thank Jesus for each one.

Fourth read a little of the Sacred Scriptures and pause quietly to think in your heart what it means. The holy rosary and our Blessed Mother can be very helpful when doing this. Listen to what Jesus is saying to you. After all, He is truly present in front of you.

Lastly, I remind you of the first advice, be in the presence of Jesus and look at Him. The catechism of the Catholic Church tells the beautiful short story of St. John Vianney who was amazed that one of his parishioners would spend such long hours in front of Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament. He said to him, "What do you do in adoration?" The man simply responded, "I look at Him and He looks at me."

Ave Maria!

ALTAR SERVER TRAINING

It is hard to believe that is has been over two years since our wonderful team of Altar Servers last served at Mass on a regular basis. We are most grateful that the students at Sacred Heart School have returned to serving at the Wednesday Morning Mass and a few other liturgies.

As we have done with all our ministries during the pandemic, we have strived to keep everyone as safe as possible. We have been close to bringing back our Sunday servers several times, only to see a spike in cases in our area. Now we are more hopeful that this summer is a good time to begin rebuilding this ministry in our parish. Will you help us?

We are looking for students who will be in grades 4 through high school during the 2022-2023 school year. (Exceptions will be made for same household members who are in third grade and have an older sibling participating at the same Mass). We are asking everyone to go through a training session, even if you have been trained before, as there may be some changes or updates since the last time we offered a training session. We want everyone to be on the same page as this ministry returns.

As we did prior to the pandemic, a parent will be required to attend the training with their child. Our next training session is July 17 at 11:15 a.m. at Sacred Heart Church. Those able to also serve at St. Philip the Apostle at the 8 a.m. Sunday Mass are also asked to come for this initial session at Sacred Heart Church. OUTREACH

THERE IS STILL TIME TO DONATE FUNDS TOWARDS EMERGENCY MEDICAL KITS FOR UKRAINE

A few words from Father Steve: A few weeks back I preached about Aaron, a young person who got permission from his employers to take two weeks off from work in order to travel to Poland and help Ukrainian refugees. Aaron is the son of my best friend from high school, whom I've known all his life.

He has since returned from that humanitarian outreach but is currently planning on returning and continuing to help. One of the issues he discovered is the urgent need for battlefield medical kits to be used to stabilize those wounded by this war until such time as they can be sent out of the war zone for follow up treatment.

Hearing from my friend that his son has set up a GoFundMe account to raise money to purchase these kits, at my invitation Aaron is appealing to us for help. Aaron himself will travel with the kits he purchases and make sure they get to where they need to go.

This is definitely in line with one of the corporal works of mercy, healing the sick. Let's continue to pray for peace and do what we can to assist aid workers and volunteers addressing the needs of the Ukrainian people as they defend their country.

The following comes directly from Aaron Espenschied.

As the news cycle moves on, the War in Ukraine is no longer at the forefront but it is still a very real tragedy which has no end in sight. During my time spent over there in May, I learned that much of the money and supplies which other countries are donating are hitting roadblocks in reaching the troops on the front lines or the civilians caught in

the crossfire due to logistical issues and the Russian onslaught. I plan on returning to Ukraine in a few weeks but in the meantime, I am working to raise funds to purchase life-saving medical kits to take back with me. A description of those kits can be found on my Gofundme page.

Based on what I've learned from my interactions with those who fought on the eastern Ukrainian front, these kits are critical to keeping the wounded alive long enough to receive proper medical attention. I am currently working in conjunction with a Nonprofit, to deliver the medical kits to those on the front who need it most.


