

FROM THE PASTOR'S PEN

OUR PLAN FOR THE FUTURE Part Two

Last weekend I wrote a column focused on our Parish Council and how we've spent nearly two years crafting a strategic plan for Divine Mercy Parish. I promised you it would be the first column in a whole series.

Here we go. Part Two of the series.

The Parish Council read Father James Mallon's book, *Divine Renovation*. One of the main points in that book is that the Catholic Church in North America is leaking parishioners.

This trend has been going on now since the late 1990's. It's happening due to a variety of reasons, the biggest reason being the increasingly secular and indifferent world. People, especially young people, see zero relevance to organized religion. This downward trend characterizes every Christian religious grouping, Catholics and Protestants. It also characterizes synagogues around the country.

Mallon's point is that many of the things we used to do, and put energy into as Catholic parishes, isn't working today because we're living in this post -Christendom world. It's not enough, he says, to simply hold community events or establish children's choirs. Those things worked in the past because society in general supported participation in organized religion.

What's needed today is a much more direct approach in offering real formation to adults that help them cultivate a personal, intentional relationship with the living Lord Jesus. This is not the only thing needed, but the main thing.

This is also why our parish Vision Statement reads as it does. It's a simple, one-sentence statement. And it conveys a lot! Divine Mercy Parish is a welcoming community that inspires disciples of Jesus to share God's love and transform the world.

We want to be a welcoming community that inspires people to reach out and make the world a better place, all because of our relationship with the Lord Jesus as his disciples: this is our aspiration. It aims us in a certain direction as a parish.

In the Father James Mallon's workbook which the Parish Council used in crafting the plan, he writes about a George Harrison song, "Any Road." The lyric he cites is, "If you don't know where you are going, any road will get you there."

Mallon's point is that an organization can be aimless and flailing about, or it can have a specific destination in mind. If the destination is specific, then there will be certain ways conducive to the direction in which the organization will go.

The destination our parish desires is the one where parishioners of all ages have a spirited, lively and truly intentional relationship with the living, Risen Lord Jesus; a relationship that informs all they do in life. The strategic plan crafted by the Parish Council seeks to get us to be that kind of parish.

Pope Francis writes, "The primary reason for evangelizing [sharing the good news of the Gospel] is the love of Jesus which we have received, the




experience of salvation which urges us to ever greater love of him. What kind of love would not feel the need to speak of the beloved, to point him out, to make him known?"

God's love for us in Christ makes us who we are, as individual believers, as members of the household of the faithful, the Church, as a parish community whose aim is sharing God's goodness with the world around us.

Our strategic plan seeks to put us on this path, the path of being and sharing good news.





Our Ministers of Care bring Holy Communion to those who are homebound or in nursing homes. This important ministry is in need of new volunteers, and training will begin this fall. No experience is necessary. We welcome you to find out more about how you can become part of this beautiful ministry.



For your information, our Ministers of Care recently connected with Northshore Nursing Home and began visiting this week. Staff estimated that about 20 residents want to receive Holy Communion. So, we have now been blessed with about 55-60 residents who receive weekly in the three nursing homes we visit. This is in addition to the individuals our team visits, and including five new individuals just added in the last few weeks.

The group also has been involved in parish mission projects such as knitting prayer shawls, decorating the church with floral pieces for Christmas and Easter, creating quilts, and holding a Garage Sale of hand-crafted items, the proceeds being donated to various local charities.


