

#### FROM THE PASTOR'S PEN

# OUR PLAN FOR THE FUTURE Part Three

Last weekend I wrote about how the old ways of doing things in Catholic parishes aren't working as well as in the past. This is due to us being in a post-Christendom world that is highly secularized and mostly indifferent to Christianity itself and organized religion in general.

In and of itself, that insight can sound like a downer. What used to work is no longer working.

We prepare kids for the sacraments of Reconciliation, First Communion, and later, Confirmation. In the "old days" those kids got older and continued coming to Mass on Sundays. They might have stayed away during high school and some of their college years. But by the time they themselves got married and started having kids, they slowly re-engaged with a Catholic parish and saw that their own kids were prepared for sacraments. That is not usually the case anymore. At least, not in great numbers.

We're in a new era.

That, to me, is an opportunity. We have tons of opportunity in front of us.

People are hungry for meaning in their lives; they don't always know or understand how Jesus Christ, his Church and our Catholic tradition can provide that meaning.

The era we find ourselves in is very much like the times the first Christians found themselves in, a time when lots of folks were experimenting. In ancient times, in addition to paganism, people got involved in what was then called "mystery religions," esoteric practices and beliefs like the cult of Mithras, the Eleusinian mysteries and the Bacchanalia, to name just a few.

While those ancient beliefs and practices are pretty much extinct these days, people in our own time believe they have authoritative alternatives to

organized religion. They believe that they can access a type of personal spirituality that doesn't require a grounding in an organized religion like Judaism or Christianity.

People today are also overwhelmed and busy with many distractions that take them away from considering the practices of organized religion.

Paganism might not be around in North America, but there is plenty of worship of false gods, from sports to the world of the internet to extreme individualism.

All of that represents a great opportunity for spreading the Good News of Jesus, just as it did in the late Roman Empire. Fertile ground awaits us.

This is one of the reasons why we put so much store in the Alpha experience. It offers a reasonable presentation of the Good News of Jesus and the necessity of his community - the household of the faithful. But it's not just a presentation.

Alpha is an experience. The experience comes in the context of sharing a meal together, meeting other people in a non-threatening, welcoming atmosphere, and the chance to share with each other about important life issues, ultimately in the context of faith.

In parishes where Alpha is running, great things are happening. Growth is happening.

This is an opportunity that we cannot pass up. And while in the future we may offer other experiences beyond Alpha, for now this is our chosen method to share Good News, and in doing so, motivate people to greater involvement in our faith community.

For now, I leave you with the words of Saint Paul. He writes to us, "I give thanks to my God always on your account for the grace of God



bestowed on you in Christ Jesus, that in him you were enriched in every way, with all discourse and all knowledge, as the testimony to Christ was confirmed among you, so that you are not lacking in any spiritual gift as you wait for the revelation of our Lord Jesus Christ" (1 Corinthians 1:4-8).

We wait patiently for the fullness of revelation. Meanwhile, we work together, building up as best we can a strong, welcoming and vibrant parish community.

# WHAT IS THE POWER OF PRAYER?

The following is an article from *Pray.com*. While not a Catholic website, one of the founders is a Catholic, and if we think about it, prayer is really non-denominational, isn't it?

\* \* \* \*

"There are many times we feel powerless in our lives, especially in the face of difficult circumstances. By ourselves, we can do nothing.

The scriptures confirm this. In John 15:5, Jesus says, "Apart from me you can do nothing."

We recognize the need for God's power. This is the same power by which God created the heavens and the Earth. It's the same power that parted the sea for Moses and that Jesus used to heal the sick and cast out demons.

It was that power that raised Christ from the dead and brought a baptism of fire on the first Christians.

All these miracles happened through the power of prayer. Moses prayed before Yahweh. Jesus prayed to the Father for miracles. The early Christians prayed together in the Upper Room.

Whether it was Daniel in the lion's den or Elijah before the false prophets, prayer constantly served the important figures of the Bible. And we can harness that same power in our lives today.

God gives us this power through His Holy Spirit.

Paul tells the Ephesians in 1:18-19: "I pray that the God of our Lord Jesus Christ, the Father of glory, may give you a spirit of wisdom and revelation as you come to know Him ...and what is the immeasurable greatness of His power for us who believe, according to the working of His great power."

Our Heavenly Father gives us this power through His son Jesus. There is power in Jesus's name.

In John 14:13, Jesus says: "I will do whatever you ask in my name, so that the Father may be glorified in the Son.""

And a few paragraphs later, Pray.com poses the question: "What does it (prayer) achieve? Prayer changes us first. In our busy lives, too often, we don't pray enough. Or we pray for our most pressing needs and treat God as a genie.

Deep, intimate prayer draws us close to the heart of God. It helps us become more like Him. Prayer lets us hear the Father's voice and direction. It inspires us and gives us answers. It reveals our flaws and perfects us. It is an avenue by which we can repent and be forgiven for our sins.

As we share our deepest longings with God, we change and become the people God wants us to be."

Why the emphasis on prayer? Prayer is an essential part of adoration. So is silence. So is listening. Sitting before the Blessed Sacrament, we share our deepest thoughts and prayers with Jesus. Join us!


