




## **PENITENTIAL ACT**

#### FIRST READING

#### Genesis 2:7-9; 3:1-7

The account of the sin of Adam and Eve is a classic example of how everyone sins. The author recognized that there is a standard pattern: We toy with temptation ... we fall ... then we make

The Lord God formed man out of the clay of the ground and blew into his nostrils the breath of life, and so man became a living being. Then the Lord God planted a garden in Eden, in the east, and placed there the man whom he had formed. Out of the ground the Lord God made various trees grow that were delightful to look at and good for food, with the tree of life in the middle of the garden and the tree of the knowledge of good and evil. Now the serpent was the most cunning of all the animals that the Lord God had made. The serpent asked the woman, "Did God really tell you not to eat from any of the trees in the garden?" The woman answered the serpent: "We may eat of the fruit of the trees in the garden; it is only about the fruit of the tree in the middle of the garden that God said, 'You shall not eat it or even touch it, lest you die." But the serpent said to the woman: "You certainly will not die! No, God knows well that the moment you eat of it your eyes will be opened and you will be like gods who know what is good and what is evil." The woman saw that the tree was good for food, pleasing to the eyes, and desirable for gaining wisdom. So she took some of its fruit and ate it; and she also gave some to her husband, who was with her, and he ate it. Then the eyes of both of them were opened, and they realized that they were naked; so they sewed fig leaves together and made loincloths for themselves.

#### **R**ESPONSORIAL **P**SALM

Psalm 51 is one of the seven great penitential psalms of Scripture. In the verses selected for this first day of Lent, we acknowledge our sinfulness before God and our awareness of the hurt our sins have caused. But the psalm also expresses our hope in God's forgiveness, that he turns our dark, cold hearts to "clean hearts" and our cvnical, negative attitudes to а "renewed" "steadfast and spirit."





- Have mercy on me, God, in your kindness, in your compassion, blot out my offense.
   O wash me more and more from my guilt and my sorrow, and cleanse me from all of my sin.





#### COMMENTARY ON THE **R**EADINGS

It would appear that the devil didn't really know the Son of God too well. Each temptation would have been much more successful if he'd been dealing with a self-centered person instead. After days of fasting alone in a barren desert, a self-centered person would have been only too glad to see stones turn into bread. A self-centered person would have no qualms about jumping off a parapet if angels would prevent any harm. A self-centered person would do anything to gain all the kingdoms of the world. The truth is that Jesus did accomplish all these things, but not because he gave in to temptation. No, he accomplished all these miraculous things because he did them on behalf of others. He offered his own body to be living bread to nourish the whole world. He threw himself at the mercy of the authorities and was lifted up on a cross—not to be saved by angels, but to save all of us. He did not gain all the kingdoms of the world for himself, but he gained God's kingdom-more magnificent than any earthly kingdom-for us all. His obedience to his Father gained for us all what his disobedience would have gained for only himself. It may surprise you to realize that Jesus was not actually alone in the desert for forty days and forty nights. The Holy Spirit, who had just descended upon him like dove as he was baptized, accompanied him every step of the way.





Here we are. Lent. Today the forty days of the season begins. We embark on the spiritual journey.


There are two paths in Lent.

Similar to the English word "Easter," the word **Lent** was originally a secular word with no particular religious associations. The word is traced etymologically to an Old English word *lencten* (related to "lengthen," referring to the lengthening of days) that simply referred to the season of spring. It is also related to a Teutonic word with the same meaning. The penitential season in the Church always fell during the springtime in Europe and over the centuries the word "Lent" became synonymous with the liturgical period. Additionally, for the Anglo-Saxon people it was an easier word than the official Latin title. In Latin it is called *quadragesima*, which means the "40 days" (or more literally the "40th day" before Easter).

Fridays of Lent are days of obligatory abstinence for those between age 14until age 59. Traditionally Fridays of Lent are devoted to remembering the Passion of the Lord and in such we do not eat meat. Eggs, milk, fish, grains, and fruits and vegetables are allowed. Code of Canon Law 1251




