HELP CHILDRENS MINISTRY COLLECT BREAD TAGS AND DO GOOD DEEDS!

The square and rectangular little hard plastic tags at the ends of bread bags, bagel bags, potato bags, bags of clementines, etc. are made from a very clean natural resource - 100% petroleum. Unfortunately due to processing equipment they are not recyclable in your curbside cart at home and throwing them in the landfill is just contributing more to harmful greenhouse gases that cause climate change.

But now you have an alternative - collect them in a jar at home and then turn them into us when you need to empty your jar! We will then pass them on to *Danielle Cares for Chairs*, an organization that collects these bread tags and then sells them to recyclers in bulk. The money received is then used to buy wheelchairs for people in need all over the world! Just this past year alone *Danielle Cares for Chairs* collected 1.2 million bread tags - that's over 2000 lbs of bread tags that were saved from the landfill. As of the start of 2022 *Danielle Cares for Chairs* had donated 11 wheelchairs to people in need all over the world! Considering it takes at least 260,000 bread tags to buy one wheel chair, that is very impressive.

CHILDRENS LITURGY OF THE WORD (CLOW) IS BACK AT THE 10 AM MASS!

CLOW occurs right before the Liturgy of the Word during the 10 am Mass, where two leaders take children PK-2nd grade out of Mass to the Chapel in the Parish Office and read the gospel story (from the Children's Bible) thereby giving them an opportunity to reflect on the story AND stretch their legs. (And their parents a chance to hear the readings and homily!) Parents are welcome to join if you want to check it out the first time your child attends.

CHILDREN'S MINISTRY 8TH GRADERS CELEBRATE THE RITE OF ENROLLMENT FOR CONFIRMATION

Last Sunday, our 8th graders began their morning with a tour of Sacred Heart Church (with the help of Judy Pyke, Fr. Steve, Ron Vanasdlén and their catechist, Mike Pearson), learning all kinds of behind the scenes things, along with a little history of stained glass windows, why we genuflect on our right knee, what color vestments the priest wears during different liturgical seasons (and why), along with the significance of the tabernacle and the sacred oils displayed in the ambry.

They then celebrated the Rite of Enrollment at the 10:00 am Mass as they begin to prepare for the reception of the Sacrament of Confirmation which they will receive in the Spring. They each wrote a letter of intent to Bishop Jeffrey Grob (who will preside at their Confirmation) and presented them to Fr. Steve.

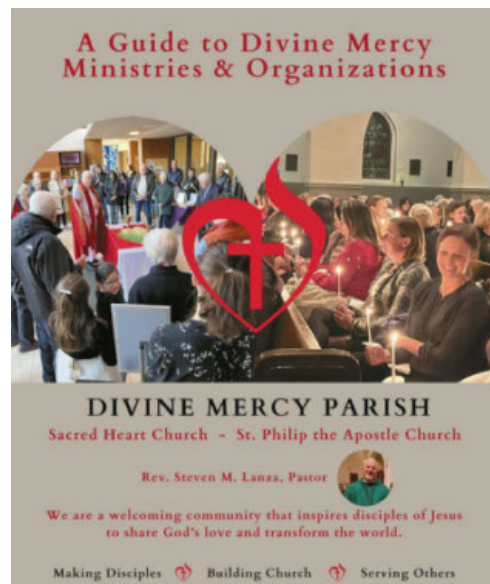
BLOOD DRIVE: OCTOBER 16

In conjunction with Versiti Blood Center of Illinois, Divine Mercy will host a blood drive on Monday, October 16th from 2-6 p.m. in the Parish Center. If you would like to donate blood that day, you can reserve your appointment here:

Frequently asked questions about a blood drive (from Versiti's website):

- 1) **How many times a year can one donate blood?** A person is able to donate blood 6 times per year or every 56 days for whole blood.
- 2) **Does the annual blood work from the doctor count?** No. You are still able to donate 1 pint of blood.
- 3) **Do I need to bring any forms of ID to my appointment?** Yes. Any of the following forms of identification with a photo and birth date are acceptable:
 - Driver's license
 - State-issued ID
 - Student ID card
 - Passport, visa or green card

NEW TEEN COUNCIL AT DIVINE MERCY

The following letter was sent to teens in our parish last week. If you have a teen or know of a teen that was not contacted, please spread the word and encourage them to join this exciting new group, which is student led (and guided by some adults)!

. * * *

We are excited to announce that we are forming a parish teen ministry called the Divine Mercy Teen Council for high school students, and we would love for you to be a part of it. This effort is student-led, which is very exciting.

The purpose of the Teen Council is twofold. First, the Council offers high schoolers a way to continue to enrich their faith post-middle school. The second is to provide an opportunity to make a difference in our community.

We plan to have six meetings a year on Sunday afternoons, starting in October and ending in May. We will start the group off with a kick-off pizza party on Sunday, October 1st, at 4:30 p.m. in the Fireplace Room of the Parish Offices, located at Sacred Heart Church (enter through the parking lot). See below for all the proposed dates/times. In addition to having guest speakers and social gatherings, the Council will host a fundraiser or two, one at Christmas time and one possibly in the Spring. Then, the entire experience culminates with a service trip in the early summer to a location to be determined.

Since the Council is in its infancy, participants will have an opportunity to have a lasting and meaningful impact on the program. Teens can use this time to hone their creative and leadership skills, all while building their faith and positively impacting Divine Mercy Parish and the surrounding community. The Council is open to any interested teens. You do not have to be a member of the Divine Mercy Parish to join, so spread the word among your friends.

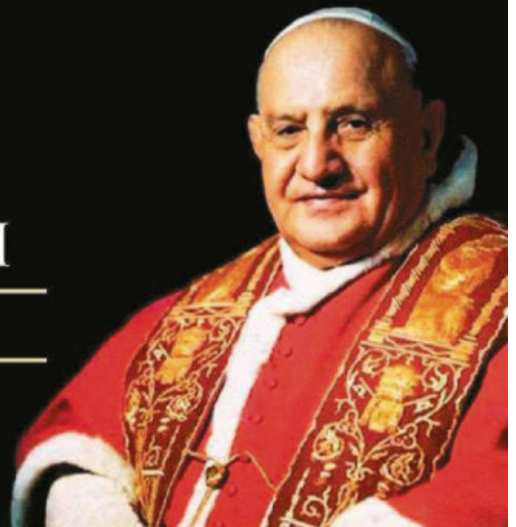

POPE ST. JOHN XXIII

October 11th



Few people had as great an impact on the 20th century as Pope John XXIII, he avoided the limelight as much as possible.

The firstborn son of a farming family in Sotto il Monte, near Bergamo in northern Italy, Angelo Giuseppe Roncalli was always proud of his down-to-earth roots. In Bergamo's diocesan seminary, he joined the Secular Franciscan Order.

After his ordination in 1904, Fr. Roncalli returned to Rome for canon law studies. He soon worked as his bishop's secretary, Church history teacher in the seminary, and as publisher of the diocesan paper.

Named a cardinal and appointed patriarch of Venice in 1953, he was finally a residential bishop. A month short of entering his 78th year, Cardinal Roncalli was elected pope. Pope John took his work very seriously but not himself. His wit soon became proverbial, and he began meeting with political and religious leaders from around the world. In 1962, he was deeply involved in efforts to resolve the Cuban missile crisis. On his deathbed, Pope John said: "It is not that the gospel has changed; it is that we have begun to understand it better. Those who have lived as long as I have...were enabled to compare different cultures and traditions, and know that the moment has come to discern the signs of the times, to seize the opportunity and to look far ahead." "Good Pope John" died on June 3, 1963. St. John Paul II beatified him in 2000, and Pope Francis canonized him in 2014.
