

DIVINE MERCY PARISH

Building Faith | Inspiring Hope | Igniting Change

In partnership with Catholic Extension, the Divine Mercy parish community is supporting the Teresian sisters in Uvalde, Texas.

Your efforts will assist and sustain their ministry so that they can continue their spiritual works of mercy and serve the families in this hurting community.

Through the generosity of **Catholic Extension**, Sr. Dolores Aviles from Uvalde Texas will be joining us next weekend at all of our Masses to talk to us about the work the Teresian Sisters have been doing in their community since the shooting at Robb Elementary School in May of 2022. Fr. Steve participated in an immersion trip to Uvalde earlier this year courtesy of Catholic Extension, and knew immediately that he wanted to share the story and good work of Sr. Dolores and the Teresian Sisters with Divine Mercy.

Chicago-based Catholic Extension works in solidarity with people in America's poorest regions to build up vibrant and transformative Catholic faith communities. We seek to deepen and expand our commitment to Catholic faith communities by providing resources to develop leaders,

ministries, and facilities, while inviting more people across our country to invest in this work.

Every school in the country prepares for the worst-case scenario, perhaps thinking that it will never happen to them: a mass shooting. This was certainly the last thing on everyone's

mind in Uvalde, TX on May 24th at Robb Elementary School. In the end, nineteen fourth graders and two teachers lost their lives.

Sr. Dolores Aviles, an Uvalde native, who lost three family members in the shooting said, "there are no words to express what has happened to us. We never thought something like this could happen in Uvalde. So peaceful, so quiet and God fearing."

Catholic Extension is partnering with the Catholic leaders in Uvalde, led by Sr. Dolores to respond to this community shattered by so much loss of life and loss of innocence. In May 2023, Fr. Steve Lanza joined Catholic Extension on a meaningful immersion trip to Uvalde, TX.

The Catholic parish in Uvalde, Sacred Heart, was among the first ever to be built with Extension funds in 1906, followed by its Catholic school in 1912. After Catholic Extension helped build the elementary school, the Teresian Sisters arrived in 1913 to teach. They have remained ever since.

PASTOR'S "TO THE POINT"

Next weekend we have a special guest visiting our parish and reflecting at all the Sunday Masses, Sister Dolores. She lives and works at Sacred Heart Parish in Uvalde, Texas.



I met Sister this past May on a Catholic Extension Society immersion experience. Courtesy of the Society a group of pastors and pastoral ministers traveled to the Archdiocese of San Antonio to see how they are helping legal immigrants integrate in the United States.

We happened to be in San Antonio for the one-year anniversary of the shootings at Robb Elementary in Uvalde. Sacred Heart Parish in Uvalde is part of the Archdiocese of San Antonio. The Extension Society has worked closely with that parish prior to and then after the shootings.

About 30 survivors from Robb Elementary are now enrolled at Sacred Heart Parish School. Sister Dolores runs a center in Uvalde to help kids cope with PTSD and part of our day in Uvalde was touring the center to see the good work they are doing.

I knew then and there that I wanted us to get involved with the work of Sister Dolores Center. The nuns who work at the center have realized that their assistance of kids is going to be long-term and will require not only their presence but the help of therapists and counselors.

Also, please note, that our parish will be working with Catholic Extension Society to organize a teen and college-aged mission trip to Uvalde and the center that Sister Dolores heads up to help with her "I Can" summer camp for kids. More on this in the months ahead.

WHAT'S HAPPENING AT DIVINE MERCY

Perhaps one of the most consequential outcomes of the founding of the school was the enrollment of a 5-year-old kindergartner, Dolores Aviles. By the time she graduated eighth grade, she had fallen in love with the mission of the Teresian Sisters and decided to join them. Since 2012 she has had the special honor of being in her hometown of Uvalde, ministering to the very people she grew up with.

Just days after the atrocities in their otherwise quiet community, Sister Dolores and her three fellow Uvalde-based Teresian Sisters, were already planning what they could do to serve the grieving community. Naturally, they decided to focus their efforts on the very people who are at the heart of their ministry: the children, parents, and families of Uvalde.

Today, Catholic Extension is working with these Catholic institutions to promote healing among children and families in Uvalde, TX after the unspeakable violence they witnessed. Catholic Extension immediately established a scholarship fund for Sacred Heart Catholic School in Uvalde, TX to help meet the demand in this town where 80% of families with school age children are classified as low income. Catholic Extension provided 30 scholarships to children who had attended Robb Elementary so that they could attend Sacred Heart Catholic School.

Catholic Extension then helped the Teresian sisters launch Camp I-CAN, which stands for Inner strength, Commitment, Awareness and Networking, provided third, fourth, and fifth graders a safe space to heal, have fun, and gently reintegrated the children into a school-like setting around their peers. The majority of the children who attended the camp are survivors of the Robb Elementary mass shooting, although all Uvalde children of age were invited to participate.

The camp is led by Sister Dolores and other Teresian sisters. The camp offers a host of programs for the children, including faith-based activities, arts and crafts, 30-minute intervals of physical activity, a game room for playtime, music and entertainment led by the sisters, and a family supper for the children and family members.

Catholic Extension is now helping the Teresian sisters with support for their ongoing mental health programs to augment existing services as needed, with the help of Catholic counselors.

"My heart is full of gratefulness to Catholic Extension, and to all the donors and everyone out there supporting the mission. Because of what you do, you're able to empower us to be able to touch the lives of families that at this moment need Christ in their lives, peace in their lives, joy and security," said Sr. Dolores Aviles.






