THE SOLEMNITY OF THE
EPIPHANY OF THE LORD

PASTOR'S "TO THE POINT"



Today we celebrate the Epiphany of the Lord. Epiphany means "manifesting" or "showing." This feast day focuses on the revelation of Jesus Christ as the Savior of the entire world. He is the long-awaited Messiah who will redeem us and raise us up.

The magi, or "the visitors from the East" symbolize the universal breadth of the salvation found in Christ. The Lord Jesus is meant for all people, everywhere. The magi announce to us that an astonishing event has taken place: everyone will know the glory of God, a God who acts in human history to bring about our salvation.

May we be led by the magi to the mystery of the manger and allow ourselves to be caught up in the splendor of the Incarnation. God seeks to save us. He comes among us to raise us up to newness of life!

Christmas Time ends tomorrow with the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord with the 8 a.m. Mass at Sacred Heart.

INTRODUCTION TO THE LITURGY

Today we recall the magi, who, drawn by the star, journeyed from distant lands to find the newborn king of the Jews and present him with their finest gifts. We each make our own journey to the Lord, and when we come to celebrate the Eucharist we offer our finest gifts—our prayers, our lives, our future—to him whose birth we have just marked. Let us in turn welcome all those who are making their journeys from near and far to worship the Lord.

BLESSING OF THE HOME AND HOUSEHOLD ON EPIPHANY

20 + C + M + B +24

Traditionally, Catholics bless their home and those who live in their household on the Solemnity of the Epiphany each year. The blessing may be celebrated before the main meal of the day.

L: God's peace be in this home,

All: And in all who live here.

HOUSE BLESSING

L: Let us pray. O Lord, Almighty God, bless this house that it may become a shelter of health, chastity, self-conquest, humility, goodness, mildness, obedience to the commandments, and thanksgiving to God, Father, Son and Holy Spirit. Upon this house and those who dwell herein may your blessing remain forever, through Christ our Lord.

All: Amen.

Final inscription on the doorway should read: 20 + C + M + B + 24:

"The three wise men, Caspar, [*Caspar inscribes 'C' on lintel*] C

Melchior, [*Melchior inscribes 'M'*] M

and Balthasar [*Balthasar inscribes 'B'*] B

followed the star of God's Son who became man

two thousand [*The leader inscribes the '20' on left*]

twenty four years ago. [*The leader inscribes '24' on right*] 24

"May Christ bless our dwelling, [*The leader places + after '20'*] +

and remain with us throughout the new year, [*+ after 'C'*] +

and grant that our comings and goings [*+ after 'M'*] +

will be in search of truth [*+ after 'B'*] +

L: Almighty God, incline your ear. May you bless us and all who are gathered here. Send your holy angel who will defend us and fill with grace all who live here. **All: Amen.**

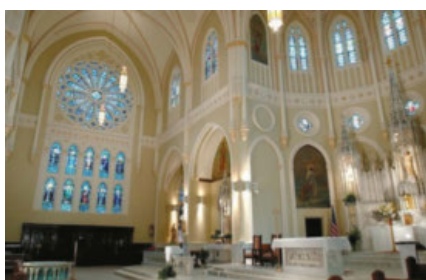
The Plan:
