



TODAY'S REFLECTION

Jesus called Simon, Andrew, James, and John to leave their places of work along the seashore and follow him. Together they would begin a new profession-or rather, a new vocation - that entailed serving the people of God and making known the Good News. Many Christians may wish that Jesus would tap them on the shoulder and invite them into something new. Perhaps their current job does not pay enough to support a family. Maybe the employee's gifts are not being used to the fullest, or they are being asked to do unethical tasks. Parishes cannot employ everyone, but they can extend intentional invitations to be part of different ministries that align with a member's gifts and talents.

All are welcome to a MASS FOR THE ANOINTING OF THE SICK, March 2, 10 a.m. St. Philip the Apostle Church. We celebrate the sacrament with our entire community. Watch for more details in the coming weeks.

On Friday, February 2, at the 8 a.m. Mass, we celebrate the *Feast of the Presentation of the Lord* (traditionally called Candlemas or Candle Mass) with the annual Blessing of Candles. Bring your candles from home for this blessing as you plan to light them for special family observances, anniversaries of



weddings, baptisms, confirmations, Easter dinner. Any preferred candle will do and can be blessed.

How do Catholics use blessed candles?

In many Catholic homes a blessed candle is in a prominent place in the home, like the family prayer space. This is a reminder that Jesus, who is the light of the world, invites us to spend time with God in prayer. During the time of personal or family prayer in your home, you can light the candle to help you stay focused on praying.

Candles provide a powerful spiritual character to an environment, which even the secular world recognizes. They can encourage a calmness of the heart and open us up to experience the light of God.

Another way to use blessed candles is to bring them out during severe weather. Traditionally Catholics would always light the blessed candle during a strong storm, invoking the power of God to protect their home. And as is so often the case, Catholic spiritual traditions have a practical element: the candle will be useful if the power goes out.

Last of all, if you are not able to use the blessed candles because they are no longer usable, it is best to dispose of it properly. Catholics are instructed to dispose of old sacramentals in a way that shows reverence to them. All sacramentals can be either burned or buried in order to properly dispose of them. This type of disposal honors their sacred purpose and returns them to the earth in a dignified way. If a person is unable to do either, the sacramental may be dropped off at the parish office and the Director of Liturgy will take care of it.

If you are looking for something to enhance your spiritual life, you might consider using blessed candles to enlighten your soul, bringing it out of darkness.
