PASTOR'S "TO THE POINT"



I received a recent email from a parishioner who suggested that it was time to bring back Communion under both species (Precious Body and Blood) at Sunday Masses. We will extend the Communion cup to worshippers at some point in the future but not quite yet.

When we do so, as in years prior to COVID, no one will be required to receive from both species. Theologians of the Roman Church have long contended that the Real Presence of Christ is present under either, Body or Blood. This is called the doctrine of concomitance.

To be specific, if one receives the host only, that is the Real Presence of Christ whole and entire, and vice versa, if one receives only from the cup, that too is the Real Presence, whole and entire.

As I wrote at the outset, we are not going to institute Communion under both species immediately, but we will at some point in the future. In the meantime, know that receiving the host alone conveys the entire presence of Christ in the Eucharist. So, you might ask, why would we extend the cup to all?

Simple. At the Last Supper, when the Eucharist was instituted by Christ, he took, blessed and offered to his disciples both bread and wine and identified himself with these elements. So the Church teaches that the sign value of Communion is more complete when given under both kinds, since in that dual form the sign of the Eucharistic meal appears more clearly, precisely as a meal, food and drink that come to us from heaven.

The Holy Father's February prayer intention is that **the sick, "who are in the final stages of life, and their families receive the necessary medical and human care and accompaniment."**



World Day of the Sick

The 2024 observance of the World Day of the Sick is February 11. This observance was introduced by St. Pope John Paul II as a way for believers to offer prayers for those suffering from illness. This year's theme is **"It is not good that man should be alone".** (Genesis 2:18) **Healing the Sick by Healing Relationships.**

"The sick, the vulnerable and the poor are at the heart of the Church; they must also be at the heart of our human concern and pastoral attention. May we never forget this! And let us commend ourselves to Mary Most Holy, Health of the Sick, that she may intercede for us and help us to be artisans of closeness and fraternal relationships."- Pope Francis

"Love Beyond Words"

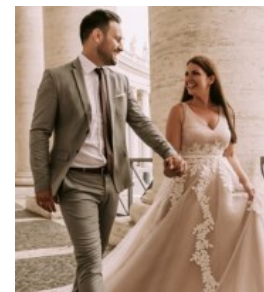
- the permanent, faithful and fruitful love in a sacramental marriage is truly beyond words.

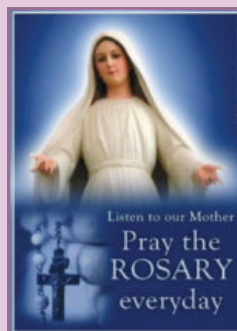

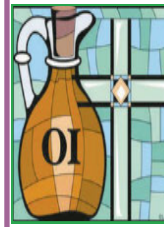
