PASTOR'S "TO THE POINT"



How is Lent going for you? I hope well. I hope joyfully.

Yes, joyfully! Too often we approach Lent as that grim time when we give up stuff, beat our chests in sorrow, and act woefully.

It's true that we do engage in penitential practices during Lent. We abstain and we fast. We acknowledge our sinfulness and repent. We pray. We give alms.

All these things are joyful pursuits for through them we raise our minds and hearts to what matters. We focus on how God is acting within us to bring about renewal and the fullness of grace.

Holy is the Lord God. We aspire to that same holiness, knowing that we can do so only because God loves us, cares for us, and sends us such graces as are needed by us in this quest for rebirth in the Spirit.

A happy and joyful Lent to you!

NOTE: Join Fr. Steve at the 10 a.m. Mass on March 10th for a "Teaching Mass". As he presides over the Mass, brief explanations will be given.

Fr. Steve will be in the Fireplace Room at 11:30 a.m. to answer any questions that arise during Mass.

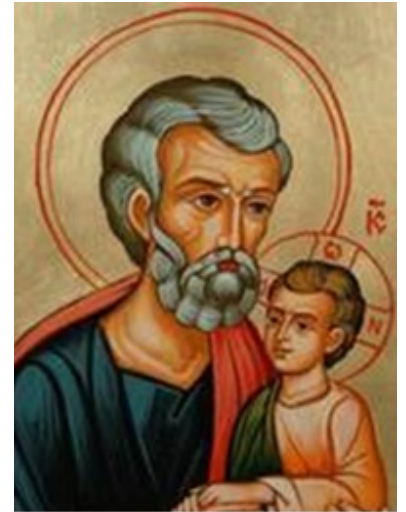
All are welcome!

Over the next two weeks we welcome into our community of faith those who are already baptized in another Christian tradition. We celebrate the Rite of Reception along with the Bestowal (Giving) of Confirmation and First Eucharist at the 10 a.m. Mass. At this celebration the baptized person stands with the assembly and makes the profession of faith as we recite the Nicene Creed together, following the Liturgy of the Word. Then the candidate makes a personal profession of faith that he or she "believe and profess all that the holy Catholic Church believes, teaches, and proclaims to be revealed by God." The presiding priest then accepts this statement and says, "may (you) have full communion with us in the faith that you have professed in the presence of the Lord's family." The candidate then receives the Sacrament of Confirmation with the Laying on of Hands, Anointing with Chrism, and a Sign of Welcome. First Communion is received during the Liturgy of the Eucharist.

RCIA

The 3rd, 4th, and 4th Sundays of Lent is a special time for the Church and a significant time for our Elect and for the Elect around the world. This is the period in which they celebrate the scrutinies, three occasions in which they look deeply and honestly into their hearts. It is also an opportunity for each of us to examine our own conscience and pray that the Holy Spirit strengthen our weaknesses as we journey toward the Great Vigil of Easter on March 30. The first Scrutiny is Saturday, March 2.

MARCH: THE MONTH OF ST. JOSEPH



The Church has assigned a special emphasis to each month of the calendar year. The month of March is known as the Month of Saint. Joseph and is punctuated by the Solemnity of St. Joseph, Spouse of the Blessed Virgin Mary on March 19.

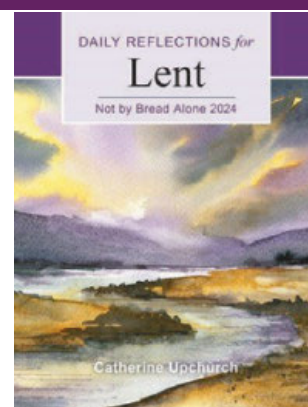
We don't know much about him except what is mentioned in the Gospels. Joseph was the husband of the Blessed Virgin Mary and the foster-father of Jesus. Holy Scripture proclaims him as a "just man," and the Church has turned to Joseph for his patronage and protection.

Fridays of Lent are days of obligatory abstinence for those between age 14 until age 59. Traditionally Fridays of Lent are devoted to remembering the Passion of the Lord and in such we do not eat meat. Eggs, milk, fish, grains, and fruits and vegetables are allowed.

Code of Canon Law 1251

Mass of the Anointing of the Sick
Saturday, March 2, 10 a.m.
St. Philip the Apostle Church

The anointing of the sick is a sacramental rite. A person is anointed to bring spiritual and even physical strength during an emotional, physical, or psychological illness. In the sacrament, we pray that the sick be healed in body, in soul, and in spirit. The sacrament has three distinct parts: the prayer of faith, the laying-on of hands, and the anointing with oil. In the prayer of faith, it is the whole community, the People of God, who pray for God's help for the sick person. And if one member suffers, all share in those sufferings. All are welcome!

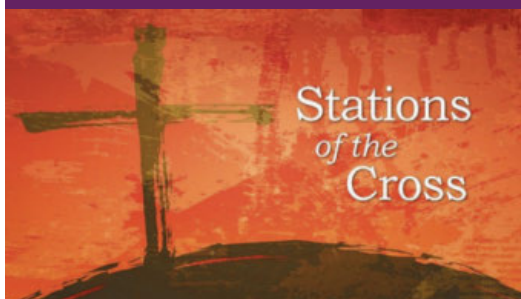

CHILDREN'S MINISTRY LESSON IN THE POWER OF PRAYER

Children's Ministry recently coordinated an effort among their catechists and students to create get well cards for Jeannie Ambrose, who has been on our parish prayer list in recent years. By way of background, Jeannie grew up in the parish, attended Sacred Heart School and Regina. Jeannie married Mark Ambrose, her high school sweetheart. Mark is Deacon Mike McNulty's nephew. Jeannie and Mark have two adult sons and now live in Florida.

In 2019, Jeannie was riding her bike in Jacksonville, Florida where she lived at the time. She was hit by a truck and left by the side of the road. They never found the driver.

Since that time she has had one leg partially amputated, and has faced numerous surgeries on this leg to relieve pain and infection. Jeannie has seen doctors all over the country in hopes of being able to wear a prosthetic and walk again. Prior to the accident, Jeannie was a tri-athlete who loved to run, bike and swim. She had yet another grueling surgery in January and will again endure months of pain and physical therapy, in hopes of finally being able to walk again.

The parish has been praying for Jeannie throughout this entire ordeal, and those prayers have gotten Jeannie and Mark through some very tough moments. When Jeannie opened the envelope from Children's Ministry that was full of cards and drawings, this was her response:

"I do not have the words to adequately describe the pure joy & delight I felt when I opened this incredible collection of precious drawings and prayers during a very forlorn and painful moment, not knowing what I was about to see. Please know how touched and blown away I am by this extraordinary loving treasure trove of children's love letters...It's just beyond my most sincere appreciation to explain adequately how special these wonderful messages of love and hope from these kiddies. I have ordered a memory box to put all the cards and keep forever. All I can say is thank you for your huge caring heart!"

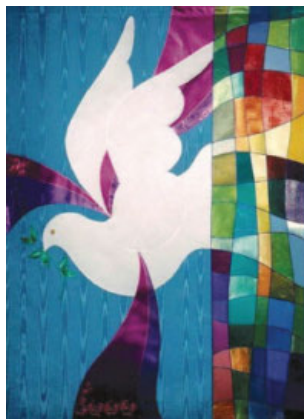

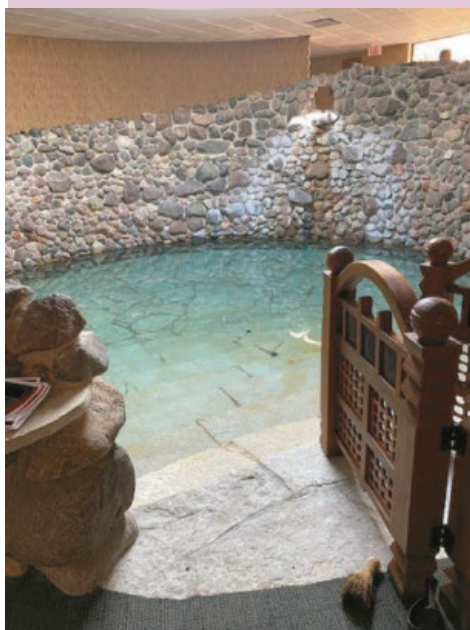
