TUNE UP

I got a notice that it's time to take my car into the Toyota dealership to have the regularly scheduled maintenance done on it. I appreciate the notice. Without it, I'd likely forget to make an appointment with the service department. Scratch that word "likely" because I'm certain I'd forget in the press of ordinary life.

Why do I mention this?

The reminder notice from the dealership puts me in mind of the invitation that was included in our recent e-blast to you about the opportunity to go on retreat in Mundelein at the Archdiocesan retreat house. If you skimmed over that invitation, go back and look at it again. It's worth it.

A retreat such as this one is not a luxury. It's a necessity.

To get away from it all and take the time to retool, or reenergize one's spiritual life, is really important. It's similar to taking your car in for that 40,000 mile check-up. It simply runs better.

I have found in my own life that that's the case. I usually grouse and put it off for as long as possible, and then finally schedule my annual retreat. When I arrive at the retreat center, I am able to leave behind all the pressing concerns of life and in this spiritual "get away", focus on the important stuff.

Retreat experiences give me a boost and propel me forward. I invariably leave the retreat experience ready to plunge back into the world with my spiritual batteries, so to speak, topped off and functioning at peak efficiency.

Time away on a retreat is not just for priests and nuns. Lay people have been going on retreat for centuries.

Do yourself a huge favor and make plans now for the Mundelein retreat or

a retreat elsewhere. Even better, go on retreat with a spiritual companion or perhaps your spouse.

You'll each progress through the days of the retreat as individuals, but you'll also be able to process things and compare notes as a duo. Obviously, if you go as a married couple, you'll need to make provisions for the kids, just as you would if you were taking a second honeymoon or a short vacation break away.

Take the time if you are able. You won't regret it. The Spirit will speak to you in the depths of your heart as long as you are open to the Spirit's promptings.

Our Sacred Heart School 8th Grade Confirmation students did an amazing job of collecting over 300 re-usable tote bags for clients at the St. Columbanus Food Pantry. The food pantry runs on Wednesdays at St. Columbanus, our sharing parish.

The students put out the word to the entire school, collected, sorted and put prayers and bible verses in each bag. Often the clients visiting the St. Columbanus Food Pantry come on public transportation or walk far distances to the pantry regardless of the weather. These bags will enable clients to safely transport their groceries back home. Special thanks to Confirmation teachers Angela Mack and Vanessa Gomez for coordinating this wonderful effort.

Our Children's Ministry 8th Grade Confirmation students have done a fantastic job preparing hearty lunches with notes of hope and encouragement for clients at Connections for the Homeless.

These lunches made a huge impact in the lives of those who otherwise may go without a daily meal, while inspiring hope and joy. On Sunday, April 11, we delivered another 200 hundred lunches.

This effort began in October and the students made more than 1200 lunches over the course of this school year. Special thanks to catechist Claudia Goodrich for coordinating this amazing effort.


OUR PARISH OFFICE WILL NOW BE OPEN MORNINGS M-F




A Special Mass to Prepare Our Confimandi Plus a Final Lunch for the Homeless Delivered










Total number of lunches delivered to

8th grade wrapped up their chemistry unit with two very cool experiments demonstrating how chemical reactions produce new substances. The 1st was a

demonstration by Mrs. Mack called elephant's toothpaste. When we mixed our compounds they produced a new foamy substance that shot out of our flask creating a rather messy compound that resembles the toothpaste that an elephant might use to brush it's tusks. In the second reaction, students mixed two polymers that resembled honey and pancake syrup to produce their "foam gnomes". Both experiments were a terrific way for students to see chemical reactions creating new substances.
