

FROM THE PASTOR'S PEN

REQUEST

I invited our senior deacon, Mike McNulty, to reflect on the column I wrote last weekend regarding laying to rest all of the former special events from the now defunct parishes of Sacred Heart and St. Philip the Apostle so that we might create new special events that not only fit with our overall parish vision but enable us to better concentrate on our priority of the weekend experience here. I want to thank him for his thought and his long ministerial experience that enables him to see the "big picture."
This is what he has to say.



A NEW APPROACH TO SPECIAL EVENTS

I love what Father Steve wrote in his column last week. I support the direction of our Senior Leadership Team and their approach to Special Events. How can we ensure that special events unite, rather than divide, focus on an enhanced experience of the weekend liturgy, and benefit in some way our Outreach partners? Here is one suggestion from an old-timer, involved in a lot of special events over the years.

One of our Outreaches is to the Father Paul Foundation. He served folks all over the North Shore while doing post-grad work at Loyola University. He was chaplain to our daughters at Regina. He taught our children how to serve Mass. He visited the sick in hospitals, nursing homes, and their residences.

And then he returned to his war-torn native land, Sri Lanka (formerly Ceylon),

and began his ministry to children who had been forced to serve as soldiers in a civil war. He created an innovative approach to help these children return to normalcy. It is called the Butterfly Peace Garden and has been acclaimed internationally. Then came a tsunami, wiping out much of what he had built.

Rather than give up he began to train lay counselors to go out to the affected people and bring them hope. One of our parishioners, a psychotherapist, has been there many times to help with that training Currently, unemployment and hunger are rampant. They are just beginning to get vaccinated against Covid. Electricity and running water in homes is a luxury. Education of children is limited by Covid and lack of I-Pads and modern technology.

A SUGGESTION

So, a new special event. What if Divine Mercy parishioners were to write letters – to a child who had been traumatized by being forced into armed combat, simply expressing love for them and our promise to continue to support them in prayer. Or perhaps to a lay counselor expressing our great admiration for what they are doing to help their brothers and sisters? What if a few times each year on designated weekends we brought our letters with us to Mass and carried them forward along with the bread and wine as visual indication of living out our faith? What if on those weekends we took up a special collection to support Father Paul in his work? What if children in our school and religious



education program learned about the Butterfly Peace Garden and made paper Butterflies to decorate our churches on those weekends? Possibilities are endless. Our 2 campuses are populated by some very dynamic people. Let us unleash their creativity with fresh, new ideas.

I submit that the future of Divine Mercy Parish as a "welcoming community that inspires disciples of Jesus to share God's love and transform the world" is not just a vision statement in the Sunday bulletin, but the way we live out our vocations as Catholic Christians. It would make it visually apparent to us and to those who visit us, in the way we celebrate the weekend Eucharist, through prayer directly written by individuals to our Outreach brothers and sisters, and through the artistic expression of our children, as well as through our monetary support.

I encourage those closely involved with our other Outreaches to St. Moses the Black, Augustus Tolton Academy, St. Benedict t the African, St. Jean Baptiste in Haiti, Just Harvest Soup Kitchen, and our newest outreach, Connections for the Homeless, to also submit ideas that would make apparent the good work being done there in ways that enhance our weekend liturgy.

AN UPDATE FROM FATHER PAUL IN SRI LANKA

Sadly, we learned recently that although the vaccine has arrived in Sri Lanka, many are dying of hunger in addition to the virus. Father Paul is extremely concerned about the quality of life for all those he serves, in addition to the possible elimination of services for those who need them the most.

By way of background, Divine Mercy Parish has been a longtime supporter of Father Paul and the amazing work he does in Sri Lanka. Here's an excerpt from our website:

Rev Paul Satkunanayagam, SJ. lived in the Sacred Heart Rectory for 4 years several years ago, while taking graduate level courses at Loyola University. While living at Sacred Heart, he visited the sick, taught in our school, trained children to serve Mass, and served as chaplain at Regina Dominican High School in Wilmette.

He then returned to his native Sri Lanka and began his mission to make peace in a country torn apart by civil war. There are very few Christians there, most of the population being Buddhists, Hindus and Muslims, Father Paul ministers

without regard for religion to all people. He established the world acclaimed Butterfly Peace Garden to restore normalcy in the lives of child soldiers. He built facilities to house orphans and created

programs to help widows become selfsufficient. And, as a pastoral counselor and psychologist, he founded a professional counseling center to counsel the displaced victims of war.

On the day after Christmas in 2004 many homes, the entire fishing industry and much of what Fr. Paul had built, were wiped out in hours by a Tsunami. However, by the generosity of many, Father Paul was able to rebuild and continues to provide numerous social and emotional services to those most in need. Father Paul recently celebrated

his 80th birthday and continues to minister full-time. Given the most recent challenge of the pandemic, we are hoping to raise additional funds to enable Father Paul to feed those who are going without and keep necessary services in place.
