



FROM THE PASTOR'S PEN

SHORT AND POWERFUL

The shortest verse in the entire New Testament can be found at John 11:35. In most English translations you will read: "And Jesus wept." In the original Greek I don't believe the conjunction (and) is there. It's just a two word sentence. It's short, but powerful.

Jesus goes to the tomb of Lazarus, his friend. Upon arrival at the tomb, he weeps.

The evangelist who records this action does not tell us why Jesus weeps, only that he does. Perhaps he grieves for his friend who suffered this deadly sickness. Perhaps Jesus grieves for all of humanity, subject to ill health, sickness, debilitation—the myriad causes of our suffering and our dying. Perhaps he weeps knowing that soon enough he himself will suffer and die. Perhaps it's all of the above.

There is a powerful comfort, I think, in knowing that Jesus who is also God weeps. This emotional response wells up from the depths of his empathy, compassion and loving kindness.

When you have experienced the similar loss of a loved one and you've wept over that loss, have others joined you in weeping? When someone else genuinely commiserates with you, do you feel supported and braced?

Imagine God himself weeping with you!

AT THE THRESHOLD OF THE TOMB TODAY

There's a lot of pain in our world today. There's plenty over which to weep. From the devastating earthquake in Haiti, to the many countries experiencing civil war, violence and bloodshed, to fires raging out of control which destroy homes and whole towns, to all those contracting the coronavirus and falling terribly ill or dying from it, to those in Chicago who are victims of gun violence and other assaults, there is much for which to weep. This list of tragedies goes on and on.

So it is that Jesus weeps even today. Most especially, today.

The Good News is that God does not merely commiserate with us. He takes action. He himself undergoes suffering and death in order to put death to death, so to speak. Suffering and death is but momentary in this world.

In the next world, for all eternity, we live and flourish because Christ took on the worst of this world and transforms it in himself. He extends that transforming resurrected reality to us.

HOPE AND JOY

Still, we weep and we weep together with God. Meanwhile, with the hope of the resurrection shoring us up we work to make this world a better place.

We work for justice. We work for peace. We work for reconciliation.



We work for truth. We work for kindness and compassion.

As the news of the world continues to pile on with story after story of pain and suffering, we hold tight to the Gospel, to the Eucharist, and to one another as committed disciples who do not give up or give in. We persevere and rejoice in a God who stands with us through thick and thin, in good times and in bad times as our greatest Companion and Friend, the One who raises us up.

MAGNITUDE 7.2 EARTHQUAKE HITS HAITI; SASSIER AREA ROCKED

In October 2016, Hurricane Matthew devastated the Sassier, Haiti area with 140 MPH winds and two feet of rain in 24 hours. The Sacred Heart Parish Community responded with such great generosity to the needs of our sisters and brothers at St Jean Baptiste Parish. Those funds provided emergency food supplies over several months, new roofs for houses, medical supplies for the Sassier clinic and essential repairs to the PK to 12th Grade Catholic School.

Now, just five years later, another natural disaster struck the Sassier area. A massive earthquake struck southwest Haiti on Saturday, August 14. The county in which Sassier is located was significantly affected, with substantial damage to St Louis Cathedral and public hospital. Many other buildings in the provincial capital of Jeremie and nearby suffered substantial damage.

In Sassier, early reports indicate that numerous homes have been damaged, some severely. We have heard that the rectory and clinic are still standing. (Some buildings were reinforced with concrete after Hurricane Matthew.) The church, however, was badly damaged. Fortunately, no deaths have been reported. Sassier is a very hilly area, and numerous landslides have been reported, including a large one that is completely blocking the river to the west of Sassier. As this is written Monday night, Tropical Storm Grace is dropping four to ten inches of wind-blown rain on the Sassier area, adding to the misery of the people. Reports on Tuesday morning (just before this bulletin went to print) indicate that people in the quake zone woke up to windy, rainy weather after a night of rainfall.

Fortunately, the two large school buildings survived with no significant damage. And, as they did after

St Jean Baptiste Parish in Sassier, Haiti has been the twin parish of Sacred Heart since 1998. Sharing faith, prayer and devotion to the mission of Jesus Christ, we find God's love in one another. (The picture to the right shows students of Sassier in better days.)

Breaking News: Sacred Heart School has recently announced the opening of another section of Junior Kindergarten (4 years old by September 1, 2021)! Sacred Heart's Junior Kindergarten is five days/week with the option of 8:15am-1:30pm or 3:15pm (full day), and includes Spanish, Music, Technology, Gym, and Library as part of the school day.

There are also a few spots left in Preschool (3 years old
