





MEN'S RETREAT: OCT 9-11, 2020 The Beatitudes: Turning Challenges Into Blessings

Father Matt Linn, S.J. will lead a group of men in finding "The Beatitudes: Turning Challenges Into Blessings". The group will explore what Jesus meant in preaching the Beatitudes, how He lived them, and how Jesus empowers us to find happiness and blessings in our struggles.

If you're interested in attending this Men's Retreat, scheduled for October 9th - 11th, it's imperative you make reservations as soon as possible. Why? Under normal circumstances there would be 70-80 retreatants on a weekend at Bellarmine Hall. They now limit it to 37 retreatants in order to maintain social distancing. Thus, we encourage anyone who might be interested to go online to www.JesuitRetreat.org and make a reservation as soon as possible. You may also call Therese Larsen at 847-381-1261. A \$100 deposit will secure your place on the retreat.

For your information, masks are required, but may be removed when in your own private room or while alone outdoors. Cleaning by their staff takes place not just at the end of each retreat, but also in the middle of the weekend to minimize risk. Meals are served in place by staff rather than the usual self-serve procedure.

Each retreatant has a private room, and the meals are wonderful. There is plenty of time for private prayer, meditation and consultation with spiritual directors, as well as multiple opportunities to receive the Sacrament of Reconciliation.

Reservations are required!

Suggested retreat contribution is \$300 per person. A deposit of \$100 secures your place on the retreat.

REOPENING OF CATHOLIC SCHOOLS / PARTICULARLY SACRED HEART SCHOOL

The Archdiocese has made in-person learning its top priority, but only if it could be done safely. An entire team at the Archdiocese has been working since April on a health-and-safetyfocused plan overseen by local medical experts. The plan aligns with all of the guidance from the state, city of Chicago and county health departments and the Centers for Disease Control. Teams at each school (including Sacred Heart School) have been doing everything possible to implement the plan to make school buildings welcoming and safe. Sacred Heart School has a plan to allow for inperson learning, as well as virtual or elearning, if and when needed.

These are truly unprecedented times. The challenges COVID-19 presents are real, and we have the humility to acknowledge that we may have to adjust these plans if needed. We believe God's grace will carry us forward.

We want to take this opportunity to thank our teachers, staff and principal, Kristen Fink. They are dedicated to doing what's best for our students and families. Like all the essential workers who have served to help their community during the pandemic, Catholic school teachers are serving our families, our neighborhood and our parish, and for that we are incredibly grateful.

We will continue to communicate with you over the next weeks about the progress of our school reopening efforts. In the meantime, please pray for our principal, teachers, staff and school families. Thank you!



OUTREACH

HELP US HELP A JUST HARVEST AND THREE TARTS

You may recall that back in April, just after the pandemic shut down the state of Illinois, our outreach partner, A Just Harvest Community Kitchen, was forced to shut down their dining room and only accept food for their patrons that was prepared in a commercial kitchen. Divine Mercy jumped into action to create a solution that would

allow us to continue to help A Just Harvest in their mission to provide nourishment to those in need wile following the established guidelines. Enter Three Tarts and some very generous parishioners.



Three Tarts is a small business/bakery/sandwich shop that has operated a commercial kitchen in Northfield since 1998. They, too, were impacted deeply by the shutdown. With the help of some very generous parishioners who agreed to fund this special effort, Three Tarts prepared (in their commercial kitchen) and delivered 200 "to-qo" boxed meals to A Just Harvest,

allowing us to continue our monthly commitment to A Just Harvest.

The response from you, our parishioners, was phenomenal.

We were touched and moved by the fantastic response to fund Three Tarts, which enabled us to continue assisting A Just Harvest through October!



We wanted to share an update with you on A Just Harvest as the pandemic continues to affect their ability to serve their patrons.

David Crawford, Director of Food Services at A Just Harvest, informed

us that their Board of Directors has made the difficult decision to not reopen their dining room until March, 2021, or when a vaccine is made available. As a result, the "to go"

boxed meals will continue.

David is currently on-site six days a week. A Just Harvest's numbers continue to rise and there is growing concern this will be the trend in the months to come.

We contacted Three Tarts, and they would be very happy to continue this once a month meal arrangement and have really

enjoyed getting to know the staff at A Just Harvest. David and his staff at A Just Harvest feel the same way. David informed us that the folks at Three Tarts have gone above and

beyond, not only bringing the monthly meals, but often much needed cleaning supplies and additional food items. We would like to continue to facilitate this partnership for as long as we can. We have the funds secured to provide 200 monthly meals through October. Our hope is to fund this effort until March. We'd like to continue our outreach efforts with A Just Harvest, while helping a small, local business STAY in business during these precarious times. This is a win-win situation for everyone involved.

In order to accomplish this goal, it requires a financial commitment of approximately \$1500 per month, which we hope to raise through parishioner donations. Donated funds will be directed to Three Tarts and in turn, Three Tarts will continue to prepare delicious and safe meals for the clients at A Just Harvest.
