FROM THE PASTOR'S PEN

INCREMENTAL CHANGE

Things don't look all that different than they did previously, do they? On the surface, much remains the same, even one year after the merging of St. Philip the Apostle and Sacred Heart. Weekday and weekend Masses continue. Groups and organizations continue. Religious formation of children continues.

On the other hand, a lot has changed. The staffs have merged into one. Our office procedures have, for the most part, evolved into a consistent approach. We have a budget which reflects that we are a single parish with two campuses. A new group has been created, the Senior Leadership Team, that will ensure that we move forward with renewal and revitalization. The religious education programs at the two campuses have been merged into one new program with some very innovative approaches to the faith formation of children. The things that I've mentioned in this paragraph are things that the average parishioners might not know, except that all these items have actually been communicated in the bulletin on a number of occasions.

WHAT ABOUT THE BIG CHANGES?

You may ask when will we see the more significant changes, the renewal and revitalization that has been the focus of *Renew My Church*? How does any parish grow and become exceedingly vital? Renewal and revitalization come in small steps, which oftentimes happen behind the scenes. Sometimes those small steps are crucial (and are acknowledged as such as they are undertaken), but the fruit of those small, crucial steps are not seen until . . . later.

We are putting a lot of trust in those parishes around the country and elsewhere in the world that have used Alpha as a tool to produce growth. We've piloted Alpha. We are at the point where we will begin the first

season of Alpha this fall when it will be open to everyone.

The parishes already engaged with Alpha tell us it takes about three years to bear fruit. So it's going to take some time to see results.

WHAT CAN YOU DO?

The first thing you can do is pray. Pray for the success of Alpha. Pray for the Holy Spirit to stir among the people of God here at Divine Mercy parish. Pray that they embrace and attend Alpha. Pray that we become fearless witnesses to the Good News of Jesus Christ. Pray that we each might personally invite a friend or a family member who is disengaged from the Church to come to the first Alpha session in the fall. Pray that we will each have the strength to accompany the one we invite.

Alpha provides a safe place for people to explore faith. It's a safe place where they can ask questions or make comments without being judged.

Alpha is not the entire answer, but it's a great start. I loved the videos. I loved the time together. You will too.

CHECK OUT 4:30 SUNDAY MASS

Beginning this fall, the Sunday evening 4:30 Mass at Sacred Heart Church will have a new ensemble to help us sing and praise God as we gather. Perhaps you've met Mathieu Mieling, the lead vocalist and leader of the upcoming 4:30 ensemble. He's been making the rounds of weekend Masses to cantor as a way of introducing himself to the community.

Todd Gresick, our Music Director, and I have met with Mathieu several times in order to set a tone for the 4:30 Mass, which will include praise music. If you don't know what



"praise music" is I suggest you come to a 4:30 Mass in the fall and find out.

Our hope is that the 4:30 Mass will become a venue for people attracted to this style of music as we lift our voices in praise of the God who makes all things new.

NO SILVER BULLET

There is no one thing, one approach, one program, one ministry, or one procedure that will effect change across the life of our parish. It will be a constellation of many things, steps, programs, ministries and approaches.

Overall, our guiding vision is that we are all called to evangelize (spread the Good News of Jesus), every one of us in the entire parish, from top to bottom, side to side—and in everything we do. We seek to: Make Disciples, Build Church and Serve Others.

In other words, if it's **not** about evangelization and discipleship, if it's **not** about building each other up, and then going out to change the world through service and outreach, we will jettison it because it's not helping us to be who we want to be and who we need to be.

In the end, it comes down to vision. As our tagline states, we are about: Making Disciples, Building Church, Serving Others!

SAINT AUGUSTINE, BISHOP & DOCTOR OF THE CHURCH

"St. Augustine of Hippo is the patron of (theologians and) brewers because of his conversion from a former life of loose living, which included parties, entertainment, and worldly ambitions. His complete turnaround and conversion has been an inspiration to many who struggle with a particular vice or habit they long to break.

This famous son of St. Monica was born in Africa and spent many years of his life in wicked living and in false beliefs. Though he was one of the most intelligent men who ever lived and though he had been brought up a Christian, his sins of impurity and his pride darkened his mind so much, that he could not see or understand the Divine truth anymore. Through the prayers of his holy mother and the marvelous preaching of St. Ambrose, Augustine finally became convinced that Christianity was the one true religion. Yet he did not become a Christian then, because he thought he could never live a pure life. One day, however, he heard about two men who had suddenly been converted on reading the life of



St. Antony, and he felt terrible ashamed of himself. "What are we doing?" he cried to his friend Alipius. "Unlearned people are taking Heaven by force, while we, with all our knowledge, are so cowardly that we keep rolling around in the mud of our sins!"

Full of bitter sorrow, Augustine flung himself out into the garden and cried out to God, "How long more, O Lord? Why does not this hour put an end to my sins?" Just then he heard a child singing, "Take up and read!" Thinking that God intended him to hear those words, he picked up the book of the Letters of St. Paul, and read the first passage his gaze fell on. It was just what Augustine needed, for in it, St. Paul says to put away all impurity and to live in imitation of Jesus. That did it! From then on, Augustine began a new life.

He was baptized, became a priest, a bishop, a famous Catholic writer, Founder of religious priests, and one of the greatest saints that ever lived. He became very devout and charitable, too. On the wall of his room he had the following sentence written in large letters: "Here we do not speak evil of anyone." St. Augustine overcame strong heresies, practiced great poverty and supported the poor, preached very often and prayed with great fervor right up until his death. "Too late have I loved You!" he once cried to God, but with his holy life he certainly made up for the sins he committed before his conversion. His feast day is August 28th." (St. Monica's is August 27th.)


