

FROM THE PASTOR'S PEN

BUSY?

Normally this time of year we'd all be running around trying to finish up all our Christmas preparations, attend parties and social gatherings, deck the halls (so to speak), and get those greeting cards in the mail. Stuff like that.

The pandemic may have put a crimp in that typical busy-ness. Or perhaps it has intensified things, given that some parents have to help with elearning and we all have to continually re-think how we are doing things in order to accomplish what we need to do and also be safe in doing it.

I can tell you this, though, we're all better off, if during this season of Advent we carve out a bit of space and time to allow the Holy Spirit to soothe us, comfort us, and enliven us. For me that means extra prayer time.

It also means a few other practices that you might also want to adopt (if you've not already done so). For example—

- After a certain time in the evening, and for me that's usually after supper, I simply don't look at my smart phone. Yes, I still pick up on calls. But I studiously avoid checking my emails in the time between supper and going to sleep. Those emails will still be there in the morning when I have more energy for dealing with whatever issues they may bring me.
- Doing some spiritual reading. You'd think I do that all the time, given my profession, but I don't, at least, not on a daily basis. I love the little books we give out for free in Advent and Lent. I read the selection for each day in Advent as part of my Morning Prayer routine. Those selections get me thinking and putting God and kingdom issues before all else, as should be. The selections also make me calmer, ready to enter into the daily business of the parish.

 This season I also try and catch up with folks I haven't talked to in a while. For me, that includes family and friends, people who have known me for many years now, but whom I generally take for granted. I know I shouldn't. But I do. Advent offers me an opportunity to touch base with them, reminding myself and them that I never want to deliberately take these special people for granted. They are a gift in my life and should be treated as such, including reaching out and communicating with them at this time of year.

These kinds of activities have helped me in the past to deal with the busy ramp up to the holiday season. You probably have your own unique practices to help you slow down and recapture meaning and significance in your life and therefore not allow the myriad of busy activities to impact your soulfulness in this season.

We savor Advent as best we can and prepare for the joy of Christmas, even in a pandemic. Blessings on you!

GAUDETE!

That's the Latin word in the command form, bidding one another, "Be joyful!"

That's also the ancient description for this Third Sunday of Advent, Gaudete Sunday. We describe it as such because the Christmas season is right around the corner. Only one more Advent Sunday and then Christmas is upon us.

There is a lot which would prompt us to be joyful. So many wonderful people are stepping up and meeting the needs produced by this pandemic.

Gaudete, indeed!

ST. JOHN OF THE CROSS FEAST DAY: DECEMBER 14

John is a saint because his life was a heroic effort to live up to his name: "of the Cross." The folly of the cross came to full realization in time. "Whoever wishes to come after me must deny himself, take up his cross, and follow me" (Mark 8:34b) is the story of John's life. The Paschal Mystery—through death to life strongly marks John as reformer, mystic-poet, and theologian-priest.

Ordained a Carmelite priest in 1567 at age 25, John met Teresa of Avila and like her, vowed himself to the primitive Rule of the Carmelites. As partner with Teresa and in his own right, John engaged in the work of reform, and came to experience the price of reform: increasing opposition, misunderstanding, persecution, imprisonment. He came to know the cross acutely—to experience the dying of Jesus—as he sat month after month in his dark, damp, narrow cell with only his God.

Yet, the paradox! In this dying of imprisonment John came to life, uttering poetry. In the darkness of the dungeon, John's spirit came into the Light. There are many mystics, many poets; John is unique as mystic -poet, expressing in his prison-cross the ecstasy of mystical union with God in the Spiritual Canticle.

But as agony leads to ecstasy, so John had his Ascent to Mt. Carmel, as he named it in his prose masterpiece. As man-Christian-Carmelite, he experienced in himself this purifying ascent; as spiritual director, he sensed it in others; as psychologisttheologian, he described and analyzed it in his prose writings. His prose works are outstanding in underscoring the cost of discipleship, the path of union with God: rigorous discipline, abandonment, purification. Uniquely and strongly John underlines the gospel paradox: The cross leads to resurrection,

agony to ecstasy, darkness to light, abandonment to possession, denial to self to union with God. If you want to save your life, you must lose it. John is truly "of the Cross." He died at 49—a life short, but full.

REFLECTION

In his life and writings, John of the Cross has a crucial word for us today. We tend to be rich, soft, comfortable. We shrink even from words like selfdenial, mortification, purification, asceticism, discipline. We run from the cross. John's message—like the gospel—is loud and clear: Don't—if you really want to live!




LOOK WHAT'S HAPPENING AT SACRED HEART SCHOOL!



The 6th grade is exploring the visible light spectrum. Here they are using spectroscopes to develop an understanding that white light is composed of all the different colors of light. The spectroscope can bend white light and divide it into its component colors of red, orange, yellow, green, blue, indigo, and violet.





In religion class our 8th graders are preparing for Christmas with a Liturgical Season Wheel.



8th grade has started their chemistry unit this trimester. We are not letting the absence of our science lab stop us from doing experiments. In this lab, students were part of a crime scene investigation; using their knowledge of physical and chemical properties of matter to determine which suspect left behind their signature powder at the crime scene.





1st grade is using tens and ones cards to play the Sandwich Game and compare numbers.









6th grade is learning about Ancient Egypt, and specifically mummification! They put their knowledge to use and mummified oranges in social studies using baking soda, salt, and cinnamon!
