FROM THE PASTOR'S PEN

ANNUAL CATHOLIC APPEAL

This weekend we participate in the commitment Sunday for the Annual Catholic Appeal. We do this every year right before Ash Wednesday.

In the past, many of you have been very generous in responding to the Appeal. Please do as you have done in the past and respond as generously as possible this year. I will join you in that act of generosity and make a personal pledge to the Appeal. Together we can be a force for good throughout the Archdiocese by making a pledge.

As I mentioned in my homily last weekend, we seem to be built by God for doing good, extending ourselves in compassion toward those in need. I referenced some recent scientific studies that back this up.

GIVING IS A GOOD THING

Doing good decreases stress. There's a 2013 study that shows a relationship between volunteering and hypertension. Researchers discovered that adults over the age of 50 who volunteered approximately four hours a week were 40% less likely than non-volunteers to have developed hypertension four years later.

A 2010 study showed that the less people gave away, the less generous people were, the higher their cortisol levels. (Cortisol levels are linked to stress.)

Researchers from the University of Buffalo have found a link between giving, unselfishness and longer life spans.

And that "rush" you feel after doing a good deed? It's called "helper's high." It's produced when our brains release endorphins, the feel-good chemical of the brain. When we do good for

others, our brain's pleasure center lights up, producing this high.

Researchers at the University of Wisconsin at Madison found that altruists in the office are more likely to be committed to their work and less likely to quit their jobs. They also discovered that people in their mid-30's who rated helping others in their work as important reported they themselves were happier with their life than those who *don't* make helping others a priority.

BUILT FOR GIVING

Scripture has been preaching all of this for centuries.

God loves a cheerful giver!

It seems we're built by God to give of ourselves! We are at our best when we reach out to others, helping, assisting, giving, healing.

The Annual Catholic Appeal is just one more avenue by which we can do good.

Thank you for all that you do to bring us all one step closer to the kingdom of God! Thank you for your generous response! Thank you for doing good!

HEALING OURSELVES FROM A PLACE OF CENTERING PRAYER: SAVE THE DATE

Be Still and Know That I am God.

(Psalm 46:10)

This simple wisdom saying is an invitation given to you by God during this Lenten Season. It is a call to take time and set aside some of your activities to explore the rich wisdom and teachings of the Contemplative tradition through the Method of Centering Prayer, and come into intimate relationship with God, with yourself, with others, and learn how to rest in God in silence, stillness, and solitude. It is our hope that this journey will transform your relationship with yourself, others, and most importantly, with God.

This five-week course is an opening to the presence of God through contemplative dimension of the Gospel. The topics for the course include: The Spiritual Journey with Fr. Thomas Keating, (A Cistercian Trappist monk); Who is God - Attitudes Toward God; Emotional Programs for Happiness; and the Spiritual and Psychological Experience of Centering Prayer. Centering Prayer is a contemporary prayer of the heart, a prayer of simplicity, a prayer of faith, and a method as a way of reducing obstacles to the development of grace.

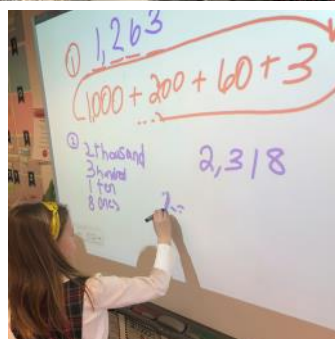
The fourth and fifth grade students helped out at Feed My Starving Children
