## FROM THE PASTOR'S PEN

### WELCOME

I would like to extend a warm welcome to Ron Vanasdlén (*pronounced Van-AZ-lyn*), our new Director of Liturgy and Music, who officially joins the Divine Mercy staff on Monday, February 3, allowing for three weeks of overlap with Todd Gresick before Todd's farewell on February 23. Ron will build on the music ministry program that Todd has nurtured and grown here for the past 15 years. Plans are in the works for a wonderful celebration of Todd after the 10:30 a.m. Mass at Sacred Heart Church on February 23. Keep an eye out for details!

Ron has been a church musician since the age of 10, when he began playing and singing for his adopted mother's church women's prayer meetings. His piano studies began at the age of five with his mother as his first piano teacher. His first church position was as the assistant organist during his high school junior year in his home parish (St. Patrick Church). After graduating from high school, Ron enlisted in the U.S. Navy and pursued a 14-year career as a journalist, radio broadcaster and public relations officer while continuing as a pastoral musician either aboard ship or shore station assignments around the world.

With early retirement, Ron continued his studies in theology, liturgy, sacred music, opera and organ, completing two undergraduate degrees (adult education and sacred music). He became a full-time pastoral musician in the Catholic Church shortly after completing undergraduate studies. He has completed a Master of Arts in Music & Liturgy with an emphasis in choral conducting (St. Joseph's College, Rensselaer, IN). He continues post-graduate studies in liturgy and music at Alverno College, Milwaukee, WI.

Ron shares that his fondest memory

as a pastoral musician is while stationed at Elmendorf Air Force Base in Anchorage, AK, at the Armed Forces Radio and Television Detachment. He was able to sing in an outdoor Mass with the Archdiocesan Choir during St. John Paul II's three-hour refueling stopover on February 26, 1981.

We're fortunate to have Ron on-board.

### HOW WE CAME TO THIS DECISION

I'd like to acknowledge and thank the hard work put in by the Search Committee. Members of the committee gave up a lot of hours to sift through resumes for the position of Director of Liturgy and Music. All total, 21 candidates applied for the position.

Once the committee members green-lighted candidates that we wanted to interview, video conference call interviews took place. As a result of those video conference calls, four candidates were invited to personal (that is, live) interviews and auditions with the full search committee present.

The auditions included two show pieces prepared ahead of time by the candidate, one on piano, one on organ, either of which the candidate could also accompany himself/herself singing. After those two exercises, then the candidate was observed practicing with and directing a small choir in the singing of Saint-Saëns' version of the *Ave Verum*. Following this exercise, the candidates then had to sight-read a Responsorial Psalm with a cantor, accompanying the cantor as it was sung. Next, the candidate had to sight-read a contemporary hymn, accompanying the search committee as they sang it as if in church on Sunday. Finally, the candidate played a traditional hymn from the *Today's Missal* (which are in the pews at Sacred Heart church), a piece that the candidate prepared ahead of time. The candidate could also, at the end of the audition, play or sing for the committee a piece that they felt highlighted their unique talent and skill.

After each audition, the search committee met to share their comments based on an evaluation worksheet on which they had each recorded the points they allotted to the candidate for the various exercises of the audition.

The members of the Search Committee were: Tom Brown, Kirsten Caspersen, Jay Chmiel, Sarah Cozzi, Ann Marie Gesualdo, Greg Grodecki, and Kristin Lolli. An outside former music minister, Linda Kay, from a parish in Lake County, also attended the auditions and participated in the evaluations after those auditions. She did not, however, participate in the final discussions regarding the top candidates.

Again, I'd like to thank the committee for their invaluable help and insights as we went through this process.

## **LOOK WHAT'S HAPPENING AT SACRED HEART SCHOOL!**




