FROM THE PASTOR'S PEN

AN OPPORTUNITY

The season of Lent is right around the corner. Ash Wednesday is celebrated on February 17 this year, it and the Thursday through Saturday which follow combine to form a solemn prelude to the actual counted days of the forty days of Lent. In other words, Ash Wednesday through the Saturday that follows are additional days added to the forty days of Lent which begins on the First Sunday of Lent, February 21.

That's why the ancient Fathers of the Church described Ash Wednesday and the attendant Thursday through Saturday after it as "the porch of Lent." They are somewhat like bonus days of the season.

I urge you to take the opportunity which presents itself and allow Lent to take hold of you and your life. From Ash Wednesday onwards until Easter we have 44 days of opportunity, days wherein we can deepen our relationship to Jesus and each other by prayer, fasting and almsgiving as well as any other holy activity that generates within us an intentional discipleship.

Each year in Lent (as in Advent) the parish provides you with a free booklet to help your prayer and reflection. This year, despite the pandemic, copies of the Lenten booklet will be available for you in the gathering space at Sacred Heart and the lobby of St. Philip. Be sure to pick up a copy! I loved the Advent booklet. I can't wait to get into the

Lenten booklet. I find those daily reflections are a great way to focus the day and propel me into a better following of Jesus. I certainly know that in these pandemic times, I need Jesus more than ever.

Our Director of Communication, Judy Pyke, will provide other online resources to help you navigate the season and cultivate your relationship with the Lord. Judy will post diverse resources on the website and in the e-blast. There will be something for everyone. Make use of what is shared and enrich this season of preparation for Easter.

Look to our Director of Evangelization and Lifelong Formation, Sue Lehocky, for virtual gatherings during Lent that will uplift and inspire you. (See the page opposite.) Definitely consider joining one of our small faith groups during Lent, called the Virtual Café for Lent. Groups will meet on Thursday nights and Friday mornings. See the registration link on the next page.

Sue is also running our current Alpha course. Please pray for the success of Alpha as well as the special Lenten virtual gatherings and programs.

There is no reason why this Lent cannot be as fruitful as past Lenten seasons. Perhaps our need during the pandemic this Lent will be even more fruitful in cultivating our discipleship.

BRINGING PEOPLE TO JESUS

In a recent online post by Carey Nieuwhof, a Protestant pastor and author, he writes about "Five Post-Pandemic Church Growth Accelerators." One of the five accelerators is a laser-like focus on our primary mission, which is to put people in touch with Jesus Christ. No other organization can do this except the Church. In a post-Christian, secularized world what will distinguish us as unique and significant is our ability to be a conduit to a real relationship with the



Lord Jesus.

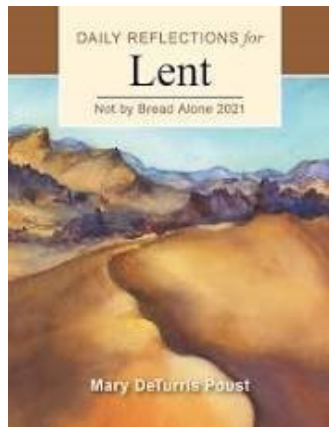
Nieuwhof says being cool will not help promote Church growth. Nor will hype or fun. Instead of that kind of stuff, being real will promote our growth, and what we really have to offer is the real Jesus, an actual relationship with the One who saves us.

By a variety of means, Divine Mercy Parish is doing just that. I'd like to highlight that for new comers and those who are "checking us out" or exploring faith, Alpha is a perfect vehicle by which to embark on the journey of being in relationship with Jesus.

For those of us who are fully initiated (through Baptism, Confirmation and Eucharist), Alpha is a great way to deepen our relationship with the Lord or to go for a re-set of that relationship. It's not the only thing we are doing to put people in touch with Christ, but it's a mainstay of that primary mission of ours.

You and your valentine probably talk about all sorts of important stuff. PRAYER AND WORSHIP

PRAYER, FASTING & ALMSGIVING

These are three traditional practices of Lent that can easily be incorporated into your life at home. They are meant to help us turn away from unhealthy habits and open our hearts to God.

Through **prayer**, we come to know God. Spend some time with God during Lent! Create a prayer corner at home; practice times of silence and listen to God; spend some time in meditative prayer; create a prayer journal; pray the rosary or the Stations of the Cross with your family. There are great websites you can find for easy daily meditations like Bishop Barron's Word on Fire Catholic Ministries or Creighton University's Online Ministries Praying Lent. You can also find great Instagram accounts to follow during Lent such as @coffeewithsaints, @thecatholictraveler, @thejesuitpost or @thedailyinspirations_. You can even pray the Rosary daily with others via @manyhailmarysatatime. There are great resources online! Just search Lenten Daily Reflections or Praying Lent and see what you find!



Fasting is actually a spiritual exercise. We fast to grow our inner spirit and life. Fasting forces us to abandon wasteful habits and to do without, so we have more to share. It fosters solidarity with the millions of our planet who go without sufficient food. Fasting draws us nearer to God and opens our hearts to God. We fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday to remember Christ's passion and death.

Almsgiving challenges us to give of what we have. It is a work of justice, not an option, for it benefits those in need. As Catholics, we are always called to share what we have with the less fortunate, but during Lent we are especially called to share God's love with others through the giving of our time, sharing our gifts, and offering our treasure for those in need. Almsgiving involves *action and sacrifice*, a reminder of Christ's passion and sacrifice for us.

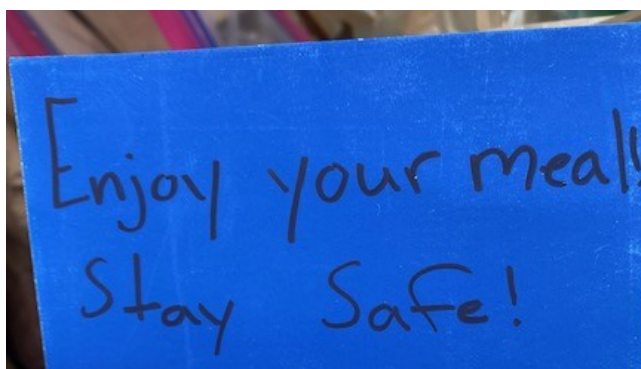
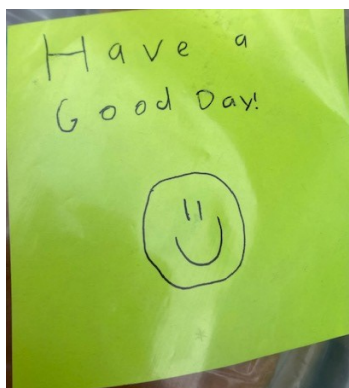
CHILDREN'S MINISTRY (RELIGIOUS EDUCATION/PREP)

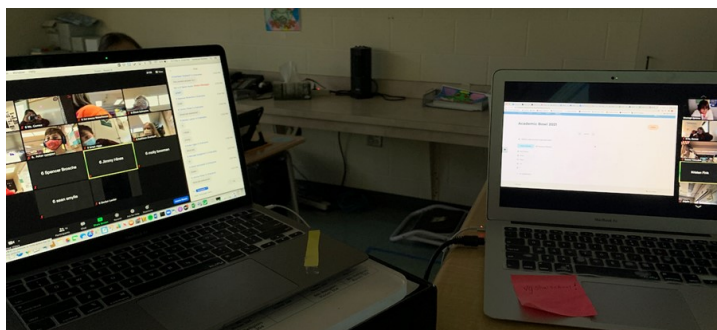

The students love playing in our mounds of snow!



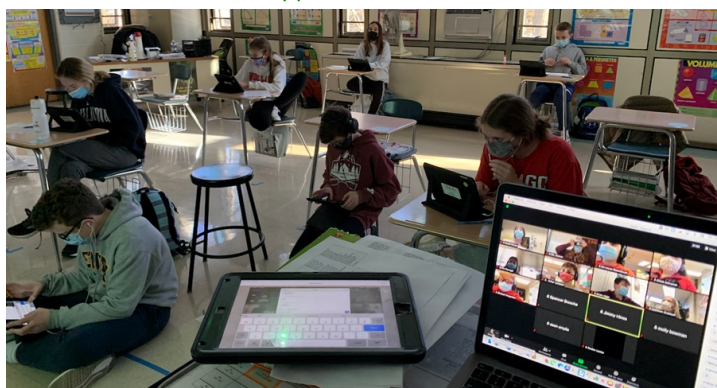
Junior Kindergarteners making delicious looking cookies. Be careful, though; the main ingredient is Play-Doh!!
