#### A message from Father Steve Lanza

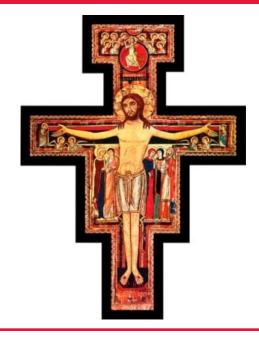
Divine Mercy parish did not exist in fiscal year 2018. And yet, Divine Mercy parish is reporting to you the 2018 financials from Sacred Heart and St Philip the Apostle parishes because it is the successor parish to both of them.

Divine Mercy came into existence on July 1 when, by decree of the Cardinal, the former parishes were extinguished. Given all of the operational changes, it has taken us a while to issue this report. As members of the Finance Council know, we have been working diligently to smoothly transition to the operation of the new parish entity. This work has been done in collaboration with the Archdiocesan *Renew My Church* team. We are about a month behind in our reporting to you, but as you can imagine, with all of the operational changes that we have been working on, it has taken us more time than usual to get this information into your hands.

We have the same number of staff members focusing on the business aspects of the new parish but they've had to deal with assimilating financial information from both places. In other words, it has been double the work for them to get this out to you in a timely fashion. We owe them a huge thank you for the work they've done.

I am grateful to all of you. Together we are engaged in the mission and work of Christ in the world as Divine Mercy parish serving Northfield, Winnetka and Glencoe.

## Sacred Heart Church Revenue and Expense Statement Financial Statement Footnotes

- 1) Sacred Heart's FY collection income fell short of budget and the prior year. We were told by our capital campaign consultants, CCS Fundraising, that this phenomenon is not uncommon following a capital campaign.
- 2) Miscellaneous Income includes Mass stipends, stole fees (donations for the sacraments of baptism an marriage, bulletin a ad income, Annual Catholic Appeal (ACA) rebate, donations for scholarships, and estates/bequests. Note that any parish conducting a capital campaign is exempt from the ACA requirements and thus, Sacred Heart did not realize income from t the appeal in 2018. Appeals and bequests account for \$22,700 Scholarship donation income totaled nearly \$40,000.
- 3) Utility costs were lower than expected.
- 4) Maintenance expense was below budget due to spending constraints dictated by the collection shortfall. A portion of the shortfall was also attributable to snow removal costs being lower than anticipated.
- Parish support of education is the agreed-upon amount by which the parish subsidizes the school. Church operating results prior to that subsidy were favorable. The Religious Education program operated without the need for a subsidy f or the first time in a number of years.

# St. Philip the Apostle Church Revenue and Expense Statement Financial Statement Footnotes

- 1) Miscellaneous income is comprised of several activities including auxiliary group activity, ACA, and bequest/estate donations. The parish received \$35,050 in estate/bequest donations in FY 2018. The ACA rebate was \$41,525. The net impact of our auxiliary groups was (\$15,478). This impact from the auxiliary groups had no impact on parish cash since these groups maintain their own bank accounts and had excess funds from prior years that were used for items to support their ministries this year.
- 2) Higher-than-expected maintenance costs are attributable to the recent identification of a number of necessary repairs across the campus, smaller projects that did not meet the Archdiocesan definition of capital work.
