WHY WE ARE DOING WHAT WE ARE DOING

Those of you who were here at home for Christmas were able to see the video presentation at the conclusion of the Christmas Eve and Day Masses. The video presented the vision which guides us as we move forward as a newly combined parish.

Everyone who has shared an email with us should be getting an email message this next week that contains a link to the Christmas video. You may want to watch it a second time. It's short. And for those of you who were away at Christmas with family and friends, you may want to check out the video for the first time.

WATCH FOR IT

We're excited. Our new parish website is coming soon, hopefully by the end of this month.

As soon as it goes live, we'll let you know. I've seen some parts of it, and it looks great. We hope you'll like it and you agree with us that it truly represents Divine Mercy parish as we gear up to continue to do great things, that is, making disciples, building church and serving others!

A PREVIEW OF THINGS TO COME

In the coming months, we'll also be focusing on upcoming changes to the Mass schedule. With the impending retirement of Fr. Mike at the end of June, followed by Fr. Dean in June of 2021, we know changes to the Mass schedule must be made.

Other parishes which have gone through the combining experience have simply announced the change in the Mass schedule and implemented those changes from the start. The Senior Leadership Team has determined that our best way forward in this regard is to be deliberate and include parishioners as much as possible in the process of change. We've dedicated four entire weekends

to the process, on top of the many hours the Senior Leadership Team has devoted to discussing and analyzing this topic.

Our hope is to thoroughly communicate the issues and principals involved, get your feedback on how you currently attend Mass, propose some options and allow you to express your preferences—as opposed to simply announcing a schedule change. We think this makes the most sense.

As we move along, you will be hearing a whole lot more on this issue. Untill then, enjoy the first half of the New Year as it unfolds as reflected in the following timeline:

- January 12: Children's Ministry Family Mass at the St. Philip the Apostle 9:30am Mass
- January 13: First Reconciliation with our second graders
- January 23: Alpha begins with the "Come and See" Evening
- January 26: Start of Catholic Schools Week
- February 9, 16, 23:
 Announcement, Commitment and Follow-Up Weekends for the Annual Catholic Appeal
- February 23: Farewell Reception for Todd Gresick, Director of Music, after the 10:30am Mass at Sacred Heart Church
- February 26: Ash Wednesday
- March 1: First Sunday of Lent and ME 25 Survey Week 1 (ME 25 is a ministry engagement survey being done in all parishes in phase 5 of Renew My Church to provide a baseline of data regarding spirituality)
- March 8: Second Sunday of Lent and ME 25 Survey Week 2 for those not able to complete the survey the previous week
- April 5: Palm Sunday
- April 12: Easter Sunday
- April 19: Second Sunday of Easter/ Divine Mercy Sunday, our patronal feast day



- April 26: Third Sunday of Easter and Preaching at all Masses about the consideration for a new Mass schedule for the Parish
- May 3: Fourth Sunday of Easter and In-Pew Survey regarding Mass attendance patterns
- May 10: Fifth Sunday of Easter, First Communion weekend and Mother's Day
- May 17: Sixth Sunday of Easter and reporting back to the Parish regarding the Mass attendance patterns results
- May 31: Pentecost Sunday and conduct in-pew preference poll for Mass schedule options.

As you can see, a lot will going on in addition to celebrating weekend Masses!

U.S. BISHOPS DESIGNATE JANUARY 22 DAY OF PRAYER FOR THE LEGAL PROTECTION OF UNBORN CHILDREN

This day (the anniversary of the Roe v. Wade Supreme Court decision) shall be observed as a particular day of prayer for the full restoration of the legal guarantee of the right to life and of penance for violations to the dignity of the human person committed through acts of abortion.

As individuals, we are called to

observe this day through the penitential practices of prayer, fasting and/or almsgiving.

sponsors an annual, nationwide
novena called "9 Days for
Life," which is a multi-faceted
novena for the respect and
protection of human life. Each day,
a different intention is accompanied
by a short reflection, suggested
actions, and related information.

LUMEN CHRISTI INSTITUE: BECOMING HUMAN IN LIGHT OF THE GOSPEL OF JOHN - JAN. 16, 5:15 PM

On his way to Rome, Ignatius of Antioch urges the Christians there not to interfere with his impending martyrdom: 'hinder me not from living, do not wish me to die, allow me to receive the light, when I will have arrived here, I will be a human being'! In this lecture, Fr John Behr will explore how the Gospel of John alludes back to Genesis to show that Christ is the true human being, inviting us also to become human.

Fr. Behr's recent book John the Theologian and his Paschal Gospel: A Prologue to Theology (Oxford University Press, 2019) brings three different kinds of readers of the Gospel of John together with the theological goal of understanding what is meant by Incarnation and how it relates to Pascha, the Passion of Christ, how this is conceived of as revelation, and how we speak of it. The first group of readers are the Christian writers from the early centuries, some of whom stood in direct continuity with John himself. In exploring these writers, John Behr offers a glimpse of the figure of John and the celebration of Pascha, which held to have started with him.

The second group of readers are modern scriptural scholars, from whom we learn of the apocalyptic dimensions of John's Gospel and the way in which it presents the life of Christ in terms of the Temple and its feasts. With Christ's own body, finally erected on the Cross, being the true Temple in an offering of love rather than a sacrifice for sin. An offering in which Jesus becomes the flesh he offers for consumption, the bread which descends from heaven, so that 'incarnation' is not an event now in the past, but the embodiment of God in those who follow Christ in the present.

The third reader is Michel Henry, a French Phenomenologist, whose reading of John opens up further dimensions of this Gospel. This thought-provoking work brings these threads together to reflect on the nature and task of Christian theology.

Jesus' final command before ascending to heaven, is to "Go therefore and make disciples of all nations..." (Matthew 28:19). It's known as the Great Commission, not "the really good suggestion". Why?
