PASTOR'S "TO THE POINT"



The Christmas season is past. Liturgically, we are now back into ordinary time, that is, the Sundays and weekday celebrations of the year that are not designated as a special season (Advent – Christmas, Lent – Easter).

Ordinary Time runs till February 14, which is Ash Wednesday this year. With that celebration we enter what the ancient Fathers of the Church called "the porch of Lent." The First Sunday of Lent will be celebrated on February 18, which launches us into the 40 days of the Lenten season.

In these days between the Christmas season and Lent, let us commit to pursuing discipleship as intentional followers of Jesus trying our best to make a different in the world for good. Each Sunday as we gather to celebrate the Eucharist, let us praise and thank God for his many blessings and gifts.

Is there a particular gift or strength of yours that you ask for the Holy Spirit's help in deepening or expanding? In the five weeks between now and the First Sunday of Lent, pray for the assistance of the Holy Spirit in strengthening your discipleship!

Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults

The Rite of Acceptance is the first public ritual for those inquiring about the Christian faith From this point on unbaptized persons are called Catechumens. They are now part of the household of Christ.

During this time, the Catechumens consider what God is saying to them in the Scriptures, what changes in their life they need to make to respond to God's inspiration, and what Baptism in the Catholic Church means. When a Catechumen and the priest and the parish team working with him or her believes the person is ready to make a faith commitment to Jesus in the Catholic Church, the next step is the request for baptism and the celebration of the Rite of Election.

The Rite of Election includes the enrollment of names of all the Catechumens seeking baptism at the coming Easter Vigil. Typically, on the first or second Sunday of Lent, the Catechumens, their sponsors and families gather at the cathedral church. The Catechumens publicly express their desire for baptism to the diocesan bishop. Their names are recorded in a book and they are called the Elect. On this Sunday at Mass, we offer the Rite of Sending Forth so we can acknowledge the beginning of the final period of preparation leading to initiation at the Easter Vigil.

The days of Lent are the final Period of Purification and Enlightenment leading up to the Easter Vigil. Lent is a period of preparation marked by prayer, study, and spiritual direction for the Elect, and prayers for them by the parish communities. The Celebration of the Sacraments of Initiation takes place during the Easter Vigil Liturgy on Holy Saturday when the Elect receives the sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation and Holy Eucharist. Now the person is fully initiated into the Catholic Church.

For Catholics who have been Baptized, Confirmed and made First Communion but then drifted from the faith, the way they return is through the Sacrament of Penance. Catholics who were baptized but never received Confirmation and/or Eucharist also participate in a period of formation. This process of formation is completed with the reception of the Sacraments of Confirmation and Holy Communion throughout the year.


