# **HOW DID THEY DO IT?**

When I think back on my mom and dad and their participation in the Greatest Generation, I wonder how they managed to get through World War II and the privations it sprung upon them. Dad fought with the 83<sup>rd</sup> Infantry Division in Europe. He was away from home for the duration. Most days, from the time he hit the Normandy beach (D plus 7, I think) till he found himself with frostbite in the Hurtgen Forest, were horrible days marked by combat or by the imminent threat of combat.

How did he do it? How did they do it, get through it, day after day?

Aside from those we love who are afflicted with COVID, some of whom are fighting for their lives, our own experience with this pandemic is nowhere near as frightful and difficult as what the Greatest Generation endured in those war years. And yet, these are not easy days, not by a long stretch.

I'm getting stir crazy from seeing the same four walls way too much. I don't feel like exercising (which doesn't help the situation).

And with the constant, never ending Zoom meetings, I definitely feel as if I am caught up in some demented version of the old Hollywood Squares TV game show that is much less entertaining that that old show was. Not that I'm really complaining about Zoom...

What would we do without it or without other similar programs? Thank goodness for these platforms that enable us to conduct business and meet face to face, even if that meeting is virtual and not in person.

Maybe what I'm really saying is that everything feels a bit flat and monotonous these days. It's getting to me.

**GRATEFUL** 

But then, in the midst of my selfpitying monotony and my staring at four walls lethargy, I remind myself that the people of this parish are amazing. Truly, you are a gift to me!

People have sent the nicest cards, notes and emails in these pandemic days. Folks certainly stepped up and continue to help with the disinfecting and other safety measures at Mass. That's a lot of people giving of themselves to enable us to be open for in-person worship. The Parish Council continues to move resolutely through the strategic planning process, step by step, meeting after meeting. The same goes for the Senior Leadership Team, Finance Council, our school board and children's ministry board.

Our Christmas collection this year was outstanding. (We'll get that report to you in a few weeks, as we are still receiving envelopes; if you need to, send yours in!). We are continuing to assist our sharing parishes and our overseas ministries.


So I suppose I am also telling myself: stop complaining!

We all have the support of each other. It's a sound, solid support

made up of an entire network of caring parishioners. For that, I am deeply grateful. And excited!


# FR. PAUL SRI LANKA OUTREACH MINISTRY


# LOOK WHAT'S HAPPENING AT SACRED HEART SCHOOL!

So until then...more of this!








During their class Morning Meeting, the 6th graders shared the accessories they chose for Funky Friday.
