FROM THE PASTOR'S PEN

THE PRIMACY OF VISION

In last week's column I ended up with three ingredients which will help us navigate change as we move forward with *Renew My Church* phase five which is "Building the New Reality." In order to get to that new reality as a parish I mentioned the following.

Preaching the vision

People need to hear "this is what we are striving for as a parish, and this is who we aspire to be" to help them visualize and embrace the specific steps necessary to get from here to there.

Praying for help
Individual and communal change of
this sort isn't going to happen
without appeal to the Holy Spirit.
We're never going to get there
without God's assistance.

Pushing forward with humility
Sometimes it will seem like nothing is happening. Mistakes will be made.
We will not have all the answers, all the time. So, what do we do? Is it better to play it safe and do nothing? We must also rely on humility and perseverance, virtues we can cultivate as we rely on the grace of God, the support of one another, and the inspiration found in the richness of our tradition as we all journey together on this pilgrimage of renewal.

What I'd like to do now is focus on *vision*. If you were not visiting family elsewhere, and were here for one of the Christmas Eve or Day Masses, you saw the video presentation which was played after Communion at all those liturgies. The video was also sent out in our parish e-blast on January 16th.

The video presented the vision which guides us as we move forward with phase five of Renew My Church (Building the New Reality) at Divine Mercy parish. There are three parts to the vision which drives us.

First: Knowing Jesus

We aim to create a parish culture that supports, encourages, and challenges everybody to cultivate a personal relationship with Jesus Christ. In our modern secular world it's not enough to know about Jesus. I want us to know Jesus.

There's a big difference between knowing about someone and knowing someone. I want this parish to promote Jesus as someone each of us knows as a friend, as Savior, as the one person above all other persons who is "the way, the truth, and the life" (John 14:16).

That goes for young people, too! We aim to generate among children the same sort of excitement and passion in Church, and in Church related activities, that our youth exhibit over sports, consumerism, and social media—excitement and passion generated all because they, too, know Jesus.

Second: It's the Weekend! We aim to create a parish culture which makes the weekend experience here something that draws us in because it is life-giving and attractive with a warm welcome, hospitality, different styles of music and strong homilies. We want the weekend experience to be one that we can take with us throughout the rest of the week, an experience that we look forward to each weekend, and an experience that we want to share and tell others about, because it's so life-giving and exciting.

Third: Inclusive and Open
We are aiming to create a parish culture characterized by hospitality, a welcoming attitude that invites others to walk with us on the journey of life no matter who they are—because God accepts us all, for after all, God made us all in the image and likeness of God.

The steps we will need to take to get



to this type of parish culture require time and patience, and a lot of goodwill. As we move forward in pursuit of this three-fold vision it won't be "business as usual." In point of fact, we don't want to simply maintain things as they've always been. That maintenance mode is what got us to this place and the need for renewal and revitalization.

The Holy Spirit will not let us down if we open our hearts to that Spirit and ask for God's help in moving forward. I, for one, think that this is all exciting. Such possibilities await us! A vibrant, growing, amazing parish awaits us!

Lord, make it so!

SACRED HEART RECTORY WINDOW & DOOR PROJECT

In early fall, the replacement of the drafty, 100-year-old windows in the Sacred Heart rectory began, along with the three storm doors in the back of the rectory. As of today, most have been replaced. The project has been a tremendous success with reduced energy bills, better temperature control, and enhanced curb appeal!

This project was initiated by parishioners. No capital campaign funds or savings were, or will be, used for this project. To date, \$91,000 has been collected to cover the \$130,000 cost for replacement of the windows and doors.

2nd graders are also busy learning about the different parts of a letter. They are learning how to properly write a thank you letter and address an envelope.








7th grade continues to study the diversity of life. They learned how to use compound microscopes to view microscopic protists. They were truly amazed at how much life can be found in a drop of pond water.
