FROM THE PASTOR'S PEN

Mission Appeal

Next weekend we will hear from guest homilists, a priest and a bishop, who will be making the annual mission appeal at both our houses of worship, Sacred Heart and St. Philip the Apostle. It is a responsibility of all members of the Church to support the missions.

After all, our goal is to make disciples of all the nations. This charge is set before us by Jesus himself (Matthew 28:19).

We are not a "sit still" Church. We are an "on the go" Church. That commission of Jesus to us, his disciples, begins with the command "go" as in "Go, therefore, and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you."

Goal

The task is set before us by the Lord: make disciples.

That is also the first part of our parish mission statement, which reads: Making Disciples, Building Church, Serving Others.

In the first instance, our goal is to help people cultivate a living relationship with the Lord Jesus. He is the Master, we are his disciples. He leads, we follow.

The disciples, as portrayed in the gospels, were not perfect. They frequently got it wrong. But they persisted in their following of the Lord (all but one). Their lives were filled with the Lord who conveyed to them the story of God, the story of the kingdom. They wanted their lives to be based in that life-giving, fulfilling Story.

Discipleship

It's been said: consumers have transactions. Disciples have

relationships. The point of that saying is that we can certainly treat being a member of a Church (or a parish) as consumers. Why not? All of society is geared toward creating consumers. It would be so easy for us to transfer that kind of identity to how we act as members of the Church.

Except that we are disciples of Jesus, which means we are not characterized by transactions but by relationships—a relationship with the Lord himself that then puts us in relationship with each other.

Another way to say this is that by our discipleship we become a family, a family in faith—whose goal is to extend the family ever outward.

It's a big task but it is very do-able



precisely because we don't have to do it alone. We've got each other.

What an ever-expanding, never-ending story, the story of God and us!

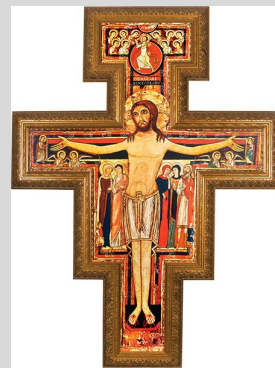

POPE FRANCIS NAMES THREE NEW AUXILIARY BISHOPS FOR THE ARCHDIOCESE OF CHICAGO

The Vatican announced that Pope Francis accepted the resignations of Chicago auxiliary bishops George J. Rassas and Francis J. Kane and has appointed three new auxiliary bishops for the Archdiocese of Chicago -- Fathers Mark A. Bartosic, Robert G. Casey and Ronald A. Hicks. The Episcopal Ordination of the bishops-elect will take place at Holy Name Cathedral on September 17, 2018. "We are blessed to have had the service of Bishops Rassas and Kane for so many years. They have made significant contributions both as priests and as Episcopal Vicars, and I express my gratitude for their ministry," said Cardinal Cupich. "The bishops-elect were seminary classmates and share a fluency and interest in Hispanic language and culture so vital in serving our parishioners. Each of them has distinguished himself through dedication, service and a life-long witness to the Gospel. We welcome their ideas and energy as we renew the Church."

Bishops-elect Bartosic and Casey will serve as Episcopal Vicars once successors are named at their present parish assignments. Bishop-elect Hicks will remain in his role as Vicar General of the Archdiocese of Chicago.

Bishop-elect Mark A. Bartosic was born in Neenah, WI, on June 21, 1961 to Joan and the late F. Dean Bartosic. He was raised in Ashland, Ohio where he attended St. Edward School and public schools. In 1983, he received a BA in Theatre from Ashland University in Ohio. He earned both a Master of Divinity degree in 1994 and a Licentiate in Sacred Theology in 2001 from the University of St. Mary of the Lake. He was ordained a priest for the Archdiocese of Chicago by Cardinal Bernardin on May 21, 1994. His first assignment was as Associate

Pastor of St. Agnes of Bohemia Parish in Chicago from 1994 to 2000. From 2001 to 2016, he served as pastor of St. Frances of Rome Parish in Cicero, and from 2009 to 2016, he served as Pastor of Our Lady of Charity Parish, also in Cicero, while maintaining his responsibilities as pastor at St. Frances of Rome Parish. Since 2016, he has served as Pastor of Assumption BVM, in Chicago, and Director of the Kolbe House Jail Ministry.

Bishop-elect Robert Casey was born on September 23, 1967 in Evergreen Park, IL. to Michael and the late Margaret Casey. He grew up in Alsip, Ill. where his family attended St. Terrence Parish. He attended Stony Creek Elementary School and Prairie Junior High School, both in Alsip, and graduated from Marist High School in Chicago in 1985. Fr. Casey received a BA in English from Niles College of Loyola University Chicago in 1989. He received a Master of Divinity degree in 1994 from the University of St. Mary of the Lake. Father Casey was ordained a priest for the Archdiocese of Chicago by Cardinal Bernardin on May 21, 1994. He was first assigned in 1994 as Associate Pastor to St. Ita Parish in Chicago's Edgewater neighborhood. In 1998, Cardinal George appointed Fr. Casey as the Associate Director of Casa Jesus while he was serving in his last year at St. Ita. In 1999, Fr. Casey began his work with Casa Jesus as its full-time Director. In 2003, after completing a 40-day pilgrimage to Santiago de Compostela in Spain, Fr. Casey began his service as pastor of Our Lady of Tepeyac Parish in the Little Village neighborhood. In 2008, Fr. Casey co-founded Taller de José, a sponsored ministry of the Congregation of St. Joseph that offers accompaniment to people in need. In 2009, Fr. Casey became the pastor at St. Barbara Parish in Brookfield, and in 2016, Fr. Casey became the pastor of St. Bede the Venerable Parish in Chicago's Scottsdale neighborhood. Fr. Casey currently serves on the Placement Board of the Archdiocese of Chicago, assisting with the assignment

process of priests to parishes. He has also been part of the Priest Steering Committee for Renew My Church.

Bishop-elect Ronald A. Hicks was born on August 4, 1967 to Ron and Roselee Hicks. A native of Harvey, Ill., he grew up South Holland, and attended St. Jude the Apostle Parish and Grade School there. He graduated from Quigley Seminary South in 1985 and received his BA in Philosophy from Niles College of Loyola University Chicago in 1989. He also received his Master of Divinity degree in 1994 and his Doctor of Ministry degree in 2003 both from the University of St. Mary of the Lake in Mundelein. He was ordained a priest for the Archdiocese of Chicago by Cardinal Bernardin on May 21, 1994. He worked as an Associate Pastor at Our Lady of Mercy Parish in Chicago from 1994 to 1996 and at St. Elizabeth Seton Parish in Orland Hills from 1996 to 1999. From 1999 to 2005, he lived and ministered at St. Joseph College Seminary in Chicago as the Dean of Formation.

In July 2005, with permission from Cardinal George, Fr. Hicks moved to El Salvador to begin his five-year term as Regional Director of Nuestros Pequeños Hermanos (NPH) in Central America. NPH is a ministry dedicated to caring for more 3,400 orphaned and abandoned children in nine countries in Latin America and the Caribbean. From 2010 to 2014, Fr. Hicks served as the Dean of Formation at Mundelein Seminary. During that time, he also assisted with weekend Masses at St. Jerome Parish in Rogers Park. Fr. Hicks was appointed Vicar General of the Archdiocese of Chicago by Cardinal Cupich on January 1, 2015. Since then, it has been his practice to celebrate Mass in a different parish in the Archdiocese each weekend.

NEW TRIER TOWNSHIP FOOD PANTRY: FOOD DRIVE

Did you know that the New Trier Township Food Pantry serves qualified residents of North Shore communities (including the eastern portion of Northfield), and serves some 300 households?



The Township serves an ignored population whose incomes are above the federal poverty line (and therefore ineligible to receive government assistance), yet are struggling to meet their basic needs. The loss of a job, the economic effects of divorce, a devastating illness are examples of why some Township residents request to use the food pantry.

The biggest challenge at pantries is to maintain a variety of products.

The most requested items: Detergent, canned fruit, canned tuna

Items most needed: Canned dinners (chili, spaghetti-O's, ravioli), cooking oil, canned vegetables, pasta sauce, rice crackers, condiments, coffee, tea, paper products, soap (all kinds) and shampoo.

Divine Mercy Parish will collect food and household items for the Pantry at the St. Philip the Apostle Church on July 14-15 and July 21-22. Please consider purchasing a few extra items when you shop—so many people need our help. There will be a basket in the vestibule where items can be deposited.
