



FROM THE PASTOR'S PEN

THE CASE OF THE CRISS-CROSSED CABLES

If this were pertaining to people and not cables, it would make for an engaging mystery novel or perhaps science fiction. Thank goodness it's a story about cables.

Almost all of the computers in our parish office are connected to our server via hardwiring, that is, actual physical cables. A few, like mine (for no reason whatsoever which makes for a whole 'nother mystery) are connected via wifi.

The other day a bunch of us were on our hands and knees on the floor of one of

the offices because the computer in that room went dead. So did the computer next door. I thought for a moment that us crawling around on our hands and knees, searching behind desks (not a lot of space between the desks and the walls they were up against) might make for a good photo for all of you. One of the staff members crawling around warned, "Not on your life! Put that phone (camera) down right now!"

I settled for the photo which appears here, the one where you can see the jerry-rigged cabling snaking through the corridor from one office into another to temporarily bypass the dead connection in the one office. How much fun could we have had playing jump rope in the corridor with that cable.

I say that the corridor cable was temporary, because it took the rest of

the afternoon for one of our maintenance crew to climb up through the ceiling hatch and wiggle around in the very cramped attic above the ceiling, an attic space that easily was 120 degrees that day. He was up there in order to drop down new cables from the attic into each affected office so that the computers could be rewired to the server.

Shall I even mention the original cause of the old cabling giving out on us? That has to do with asbestos abatement going on in the boiler room of the office building. The workers inadvertently disconnected a junction box for those same cables.

Why the junction box is located in the boiler room is something no one can answer.

The new cables dropping down from the attic are a better solution to connecting all the computers to the server. Of course, we could have just gone with wifi throughout but that presents its

own unpredictability - and our computers are unpredictable enough due to human error and glitches inside the server.

Such is life in modern offices. In former times, which I can actually remember because I lived in them, life was simpler with self-correcting IBM electric typewriters. They tell me that computers and the internet makes life more efficient and smoother.



I agree. Except when they go on the fritz or when the cables get cut or disconnected, or when the power goes out. Back in those ancient times of electric typewriters, even they wouldn't work when the electricity went out.

All machines are subject to breakage and break-downs. For that matter, so are we humans.

With our computers up and running again, I hope we've made up for the lost day spent trying to diagnose the problem and then temporarily fixing (leading to a more permanent fixing) of what I'm calling the case of the criss-crossed cables.

I still wish you could have seen us on our hands and knees trying to crawl behind and under desks. This staff is absolutely committed to serving the parish mission. Just ask Eamon (from our maintenance team) after spending almost an hour in the stifling, overheated attic. I think we made him drink three or four bottles of water to rehydrate!

What a staff! What a weird situation! Praise God from whom all solutions flow!

Such is life, on occasion, at Divine Mercy!

Children's Ministry Sunday Morning Sessions

- Sessions will meet from 8:50-9:50 a.m. on Sundays at Sacred Heart School & Parish Center.
- We will hold Family Masses, retreats, sacraments, special sessions and more on both the St. Philip the Apostle campus and on the Sacred Heart campus.
- We will kick off our year with a Family Mass at 9:30 a.m., September 19th at St. Philip the Apostle Church followed by food and fellowship.
- Our year will feature:
 - 3 Family Masses
 - Service projects woven directly into the monthly curriculum based on the Corporal Works of Mercy for all grade levels
 - 1 Saints Celebration
 - 1 Christmas Pageant
 - Sessions led by our outstanding, experienced catechists
 - Youth Alpha for our 7th graders to better know the Life of Jesus
 Sacramental prep for our 2nd and 8th graders.

Family Faith Connections

- We will bring back our monthly Family Faith Connections program for those families who want to learn, grow and pray together as an alternative to the regular weekly Children's Ministry sessions. Family Faith combines monthly group meetings on Sunday evenings at the Sacred Heart Parish Center and gradespecific instruction by trained catechists along with at-home sessions guided by parents.
- Families will gather 8 times per year on a Sunday evening from 5:15-7:00 p.m. to share a meal, prayer and activity, followed by lessons for the children and a chance for parents to meet with a priest or leader to discuss our faith.
- Parents work with children to complete approximately 20 Home sessions using parent-friendly materials and instructions.
- Any family member who would like a shared faith experience can participate. Parents, children, grandparents, step-parents, aunts, uncles – all are welcome.
