2. WHAT'S HAPPENING AT DIVINE MERCY

PASTOR'S "TO THE POINT"



Last weekend I wrote to you about the fruit of *Alpha*. We see its effects in an increase in folks getting involved in ministry and in a spirited culture of positivity pervading the parish.

What I described above are from anecdotal accounts. People tell us this about the parish *and* about *Alpha*.

Here is some data pertaining to *Alpha* and ministry: 52% of all those who contributed to Christmas Sharing in 2023 were *Alpha* participants; 54% of those women who attended Advent by Candlelight have participated in an *Alpha* series; 100% of the Prayer Team has attended *Alpha*; 70% of those who were involved in the College Care Package Party have attended *Alpha*; 37% of last year's Children's Ministry Catechists attended *Alpha*; 91% of the members of the Parish Council have enrolled in one of our *Alpha* courses.

This is only a smattering of data. Even so, I think it's instructive. Many of our parishioners feel called to join one or more of our ministries once they complete *Alpha*. They found that *Alpha* augments and heightens their ministry experience and helps us all be on the "same page" so to speak, a page that underscores shared prayer and faith, witnessing to Jesus and his Good News, and an openness to the Holy Spirit.

At the same time, *Alpha* has propelled people who are already involved in outreach and ministry. *Alpha* is definitely making an impact in the parish, an impact in the right direction!

Saint Patrick was a fifth-century Romano-British Christian missionary and bishop in Ireland. Known as the "Apostle of Ireland", he is the primary patron saint of Ireland, the other patron saints being Brigid of Kildare and Columba.

TODAY IS THE THIRD SCRUTINY

A scrutiny is a rite of self-searching and repentance. It intends to uncover and strengthen any weak spiritual resolve in the elect and to bring out and strengthen what is upright, strong, and good. Scrutinies help complete the elect's conversion to Christ. There are three scrutinies that demonstrate the growing intensity of the season of purification and enlightenment to assist the elect in rejecting personal sin and spiritual blindness.

Fridays of Lent are days of obligatory abstinence for those between age 14 until age 59. Traditionally Fridays of Lent are devoted to remembering the Passion of the Lord and in such we do not eat meat. Eggs, milk, fish, grains, and fruits and vegetables are allowed.

Code of Canon Law 1251

The Triduum The word "Triduum" can mean any three-day period of prayer that typically precedes a feast day. The Easter Triduum (or Paschal Triduum) is the three days of prayer that precede the celebration of Easter. These three days see the celebration of the Mass of the Lord's Supper on Holy Thursday, March 28, a Good Friday Liturgy, March 29, that recalls the Passion and Death of Jesus Christ, and finally, the three days culminate in the celebration of Christ's Resurrection at the Easter Vigil, March 30, after nightfall on Holy Saturday but before dawn on Easter Sunday. The "mother of all holy vigils", on this night, the Church keeps vigil for the Resurrection of Jesus Christ. It is also at this Mass that the Church welcomes its newest members through the Sacraments of Initiation (Baptism, Confirmation, and Eucharist). There is not a more joy-filled or a more glorious celebration on this earth than the Easter Vigil. A lot more could be said, but words just won't do it justice. These days are the culmination of the entire church year because **they** celebrate the Paschal Mystery which is the basis of our faith, dying Christ destroys our death and rising he restores our life.

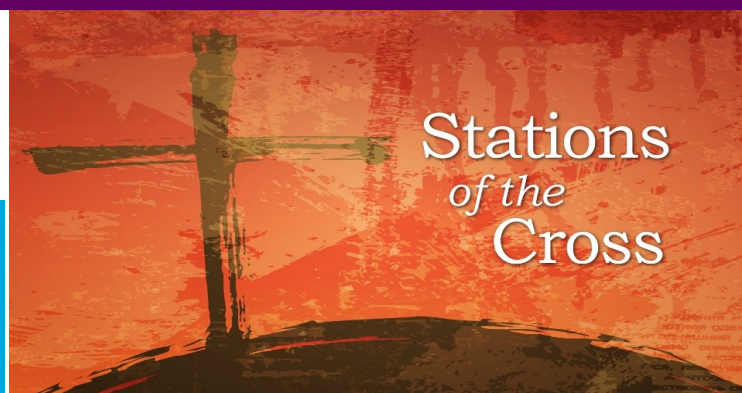

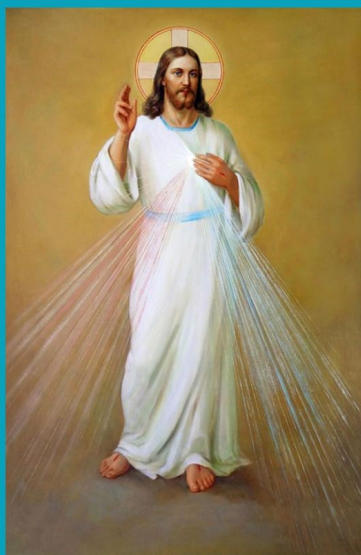

COME LEARN ABOUT VIATOR HOUSE OF HOSPITALITY AND FUTURE VOLUNTEER OPPORTUNITIES

Join Fr. Corey Brost, CSV, on Thursday, April 11th at 7pm in the Parish Center to learn about the *Viator House of Hospitality*, and volunteer opportunities available to Divine Mercy parishioners.

Who are they and what do they do? The following is from their website:

"Viator House of Hospitality provides compassionate accompaniment of young adult male immigrants seeking asylum." It was established in January of 2017, and provides a humane and fiscally-responsible alternative to immigration detention with a supportive living environment where young men can attend school, improve their language skills, grow spiritually and emotionally, receive medical attention, and work while they await immigration proceedings and for some time after winning those proceedings.

Viator House participants also serve the local community on a regular basis at area agencies that serve the poor locally and internationally. Since its founding in 2017, Viator House of Hospitality has provided a home for more than 90 young men from 22 nations.

Viator House also engages in education about the U.S. asylum system and advocates for changes to make that system more humane, while supporting the development of similar hospitality houses across the country.

How do volunteers make a difference?

Volunteers help VHH participants adapt to life in the U.S. in many ways. Among other things, they help young men learn English, succeed in school, learn to cook, get to work or back home, plan their finances and search for cars or apartments. Most importantly, volunteers help replace the family and
