



FROM THE PASTOR'S PEN

JESUS INVITES US

A wonderful opportunity lies before us. This Sunday marks the start of the great forty days, otherwise known as the season of Lent.

While we embarked upon the discipline of Lent on Ash Wednesday, the actual forty days of the season are counted from the First Sunday of Lent until the evening of Holy Thursday. Sundays included, that equals forty days.

All right, so Lent is really *more* than forty days. Fine. Forty, however, is a biblical number of some significance. The flood which cleansed the earth of sinfulness was caused by rain which fell for forty days and nights. Forty years the Israelites wandered in the dessert before entering the Promised Land. Jesus spent forty days in his own desert contending with the devil and temptation prior to the start of his public ministry.

We go into the forty days of this season and the Lord presents us with an opportunity. He gives us this graced time each year so that we might pursue heartfelt conversion, to turn back to him and turn away from all that stands in the way of the kingdom of heaven.

We at Divine Mercy Parish have much to do in order to renew and revitalize our faith community. We are building on the legacy of the former parishes of Sacred Heart and St. Philip the Apostle. Out of this combined legacy we are creating something new and better.

That spirited creation of a new parish reality starts with each one of us. It starts with the understanding that we are being called to intentional discipleship, putting Jesus first in our lives and situating everyone and everything else in that relationship between us and the Lord. It also starts with the understanding that intentional discipleship works best when done in concert with other disciples.

Discipleship is never only about me and Jesus. It's about *us* and Jesus. This is

the foundation and cornerstone of the new parish we are building.

Lent is an opportunity for us to take our personal spiritual growth and use that internal dynamic for the good of Divine Mercy parish. My prayer for us in this season of renewal is exactly that. May God foster, strengthen and nourish our personal growth, cultivating in each one of us the desire and the ability to put that individual growth to good purpose as together we grow this new parish. Amen.

CELEBRATING GOOD NEWS

As I understand it, there were a number of young moms who attended the Alpha course during the fall. As a result of their experience, some decided to continue to meet. They're doing so in the home of one of those moms.

They meet under the guidance of Father John Kartje to continue the faith sharing that they experienced in Alpha through bible study. They may not describe what they are doing as deepening their intentional discipleship, but that's the way I see it.



This is a beautiful example of what we are trying to accomplish in this new parish of Divine Mercy. Intentional discipleship is not really so new for us Catholics as is the understanding and articulation of it, and most importantly, that it is done together with others versus something we cultivate on our own privately.

While the growth and revitalization of church will be comprised of small steady steps (that is, slowly), it *is* beginning and we are seeing signs of it even now.

Growth and renewal of this sort will not be glitzy or dramatic. We're in it for the long haul and for lasting, real growth.

Carry on, disciples, carry on in the Lord Jesus and with one another!

HEALING OURSELVES FROM A PLACE OF CENTERING PRAYER: BEGINS THIS WEEK

Be Still and Know That I am God. (Psalm 46:10)

This simple wisdom saying is an invitation given to you by God during this Lenten Season. It is a call to take time and set aside some of your activities to explore the rich wisdom and teachings of the Contemplative tradition through the Method of Centering Prayer, and come into intimate relationship with God, with yourself, with others, and learn how to rest in God in silence, stillness, and solitude. It is our hope that this journey will transform your relationship with yourself, others, and most importantly, with God.

This five-week course is an opening to the presence of God through contemplative dimension of the Gospel. The topics for the course include: The Spiritual Journey with Fr. Thomas Keating, (A Cistercian Trappist monk); Who is God - Attitudes Toward God; Emotional Programs for Happiness; and the Spiritual and Psychological Experience of Centering Prayer. Centering Prayer is a contemporary prayer of the heart, a prayer of simplicity, a prayer of faith, and a method as a way of reducing obstacles to the development of grace.

LENTEN CORNER

TRADITIONAL LENTEN PRACTICES

Prayer, fasting and almsgiving are three traditional practices of Lent that can easily be



incorporated into your life at home. They are meant to help us turn away from old or unhealthy habits and open our hearts to God.

Through **PRAYER**, we come to know God. Talk to God during Lent. There are many different kinds of prayer (petitions, intercessions, thanksgiving, adoration). Simply, it's a conversation with God.

FASTING is a spiritual exercise. We fast to grow our inner spirit and life. It draws us nearer to God and opens our hearts to God. We fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday to remember Christ's passion and death.

ALMSGIVING benefits those in need. As Catholics, we are always called to share what we have with the less fortunate. During Lent, we are called to share God's love with others through the giving of our time, sharing our gifts & talents, and offering our treasure for those in need. Almsgiving involves sacrifice, a reminder of Christ's passion and sacrifice for us.

Fast from pressures and be prayerful.
Fast from bitterness and fill your hearts with joy.
Fast from selfishness and be compassionate to others.

THE HOLY SPIRIT GIVES US THE WORDS TO SAY

Who is the real driving force of evangelization in our lives and in the Church? Paul VI wrote clearly: "It is the Holy Spirit who today, just as at the beginning of the Church, acts in every evangelizer who allows themselves to be possessed and led by him. The Holy Spirit places on their lips the words which they could not find themselves, and at the same time, the Holy Spirit predisposes the soul of the hearer to be open and receptive to the Good News and to the kingdom being proclaims" (Evangeli Nuntiandi, paragraph 75). To evangelize, therefore, it is necessary to open ourselves once again to the horizon of God's Spirit, without being afraid of what he asks us or of where he leads us. Let us entrust ourselves to him! He will enable us to live out and bear witness to our faith, and will illuminate the heart of those we

MEN'S RETREAT



Dear Friends,

How can we best accomplish what God has in mind for us? How can we best use the gifts and talents of the people who are a part of this parish? These are important questions, and we have been wrestling with them for quite some time at Divine Mercy Parish.

To this end, we want to hear from each of you. In the coming weeks, we will conduct Gallup's Member Engagement (ME²⁵) survey, a census of all adult members of our parish that will give you the opportunity to share your opinions about some of the key aspects of our parish life.

The survey will be administered by Gallup, an independent research company known for its understanding of people and their opinions. Although most of us know Gallup for its polling work, the organization has been listening to people's opinions and studying successful organizations for several decades. With this experience, Gallup brings a seasoned ability to help us gather and understand all of the opinions throughout our parish.

After we have received the results of the survey from Gallup, we will use them to start a dialogue about our parish and how we can more effectively accomplish our mission. We all have a stake in the opportunities and challenges that lie ahead.

The success of this effort hinges on the completion of the survey by each one of us who is at least 18 years of age. We all share equally in our responsibility to reach the goal of 100% participation by our parish. Your opinions need to be heard.

This is an exciting time for our parish. We are taking important steps toward fulfilling God's purpose for us now and in the years to come. The process and subsequent dialogue will help us all in that effort.

MEMBER ENGAGEMENT SURVEY Frequently Asked Questions

What is the purpose of this survey?

The Member Engagement Survey will give us a collective view of the spiritual health of our parish. The data will show us where we are doing well and help us see the areas that need our attention to make us a stronger parish.

What does the survey entail?

The survey features 25 items carefully chosen to measure engagement and spiritual commitment that are essential to spiritual health. The survey will only take approximately five minutes to complete.

Who should complete the survey?

We are asking all parish members aged 18 and older to complete the survey. In addition, any person who considers him or herself part of our parish, regardless of whether he or she is a member, is invited to respond to the survey.

Where do I complete the survey?

You can complete the survey online using the a link that will be provided next weekend <u>or</u> on paper in the parish beginning March 7 and ending March 29.

What about confidentiality?

Are responses are confidential. We are working with Gallup to conduct this survey. Gallup is a member of the Council of American Survey Research Organizations (CASRO) and, as such, abides by specific rules of conduct that include adherence to strict confidentiality in survey administration and reporting of results. Gallup will not reveal any individual responses to anyone.

How will the survey results be used?

The leadership team will receive the compiled results from Gallup and use them to gain additional insight into how the members feel about our parish. We will use the results to identify specific actions we can take to further meet the spiritual needs of our members.

When do we get to take the survey?

You are invited to take the survey anytime between these dates: March 7 -29, 2020. Your opinions matter to us.
