



#### FROM THE PASTOR'S PEN

#### THIS JOYFUL SEASON

Most people would not describe Lent as joyful. For most, the word that comes to mind immediately is "penitential."

Lent is a time to focus on doing penance, no doubt about it. At the same time, however, there is an element of joy in our Lenten practices of prayer, almsgiving and fasting.

It was Saint Pope Paul VI who described the season of Lent as joyful, a little springtime. Given where Rome sits on the map, springtime does indeed come during Lent.

However, there was a deeper reason why we describe Lent as a springtime and a joy. It has to do with our relationship with the Lord Jesus and his people, the Church. As we engage in the traditional penitential disciplines of Lent, those aforementioned practices of prayer, fasting and almsgiving, we strengthen our relationship to the Lord and to the Lord's people. In those practices we focus on what's truly important, we hone ourselves, coming closer to God's vision of our best selves.

Here's another way to look at what Paul VI was talking about. Back when I was a member of a health club, I made sure that three times a week I went and worked out. I had to put it into my calendar and stick to it. As I started my workout routine I wasn't what you'd call "happy." It was a chore. And yet, by the end of my workout, with the endorphins kicking in, I felt good. That feeling of goodness lasted throughout the day.

We may not always enjoy engaging in all of the penitential practices of Lent as we are doing them, but afterwards the graces start to flow from God and we are a bit further along in our spiritual journey. There is a type of joy in knowing we have dived into Lent in a substantive way and come out the other end better for it.

We've got a week-and-a-half before Lent ends and the Easter Triduum begins, after which the Easter season ramps up. May these final days of the Lenten season be fruitful for you! May you strive to hone yourself into the best possible version of yourself, the version God's grace creates in each of us!

#### **EASTER TRIDUUM**

The Easter Triduum is the apex of the entire liturgical year. It begins with the evening liturgy of Holy Thursday and continues until Evening Prayer of Easter Sunday. After the Triduum we are into the fifty days of the Easter season.

The special liturgies of the Triduum are lovely, solemn and celebratory: the evening Mass of the Lord's Supper on Holy Thursday, the commemoration of the Lord's Passion on Good Friday, the Easter Vigil which begins at sundown on Holy Saturday, and the Masses of Easter Sunday. I hope you are able to join us either in person or via livestream for the liturgies of each of these days.

These liturgies put us in touch with the saving actions of Jesus who suffered, died and rose for our sakes. They make present for us the Paschal (or Easter) mystery in which we are recreated as sons and daughters of God. A blessed Triduum to you all!

As we gear up for the Triduum and the Easter season, let me leave you with a wonderful insight from Alexander Schmemann (*Great Lent*, 1969 St. Vladimir's Seminary Press) who observes that, yes, we are all baptized. But what we constantly lose sight of and betray in so many different ways is the great gift of innocence we received at Baptism. Easter is thus our return every year to our own Baptism. Lent is our preparation for that return, a



gradual and sustained effort to perform our own passage or "pascha" into the new life found in Christ. Each year Lent and Easter represent our actively pursuing the recovery by us of what we were made through our own baptismal death and resurrection.

A blessed Lent to you, as well as a blessed Easter Triduum and Easter season!






