## FROM THE PASTOR'S PEN

### THE CLOSE OF THE LITURGICAL YEAR

This weekend we mark the close of the Church year with the celebration of Christ the King Sunday. As the liturgical calendar winds down, we acknowledge Jesus Christ as king of the universe.

The Easter Vigil Mass proclaims Christ as the Alpha and the Omega (the first and final letters in the Greek alphabet), the beginning and the end. The prayer at the Vigil goes on to say that he truly is the Master, the King, because "All time belongs to him and all the ages; to him be glory and power through every age and for ever, amen!"

Some may wonder how it can be that we acclaim the Lord Jesus as allpowerful, that even the unfolding of time itself belongs to him, while we are in the midst of a worldwide pandemic that gives no evidence of stopping. More are being infected and more die each day. Yet we firmly believe that Christ is Lord and God, King of the universe, Victor over death and sin.

We cannot forget that Christ became victorious and reigns for ever by dying

for us on the Cross. His triumph includes his own suffering and death.

This is the central mystery of the faith. It is a paradox.


To my mind, it gives great comfort to know that the One whom we acclaim as God and as all-powerful also has experienced suffering and death. He willingly accepted that path so that we might have hope when things look the most hopeless.

The seeds of new life are planted in the pain of this self-sacrifice.

#### THE NEW YEAR OF GRACE

We have one more week of ordinary time after this Sunday. Then, next Sunday, with Advent, we begin a new liturgical year, a new Church year, the year of grace starts up anew.

Recall that we inscribe upon the Easter Candle the symbols Alpha and Omega in the night, after the sun has gone down and there are no lights in the church. In darkness, we light the new fire, prepare the Easter Candle using words and symbols of hope, and then from that brave light of Christ our own candles are lit and the Church is filled with light as the



Exultet is sung.

As we all move through these difficult and dark times, let us not forget the promise of God and the loving work of Christ. Light will shine.

It shines even now. In every heart that believes!

It's that time already! Christmas Sharing with St. Benedict the African and St. Columbanus returns. Given the pandemic, we know the need is greater than ever. We also know we need to do things a little differently this year, so here are the details!

You'll no longer see gift tags on the Christmas Tree at St. Philip or the bulletin board at Sacred Heart so we can comply with Archdiocesan Coronavirus guidelines. We've worked with our sharing parishes to determine what their parishioners need most, and the easiest way to make their Christmas dreams come true. As a result, we created the **Great Gift Card Challenge**!

We've created a Christmas Sharing page on our website under Outreach, where you can "sign up" for one or more gift cards that will be distributed to the parishioners of St. Benedict the African and St. Columbanus. JUST CLICK HERE. Here's what to do next:

#### DEADLINES:

- We ask that all gift cards for **St. Columbanus** be delivered to Divine Mercy by **Tuesday, December 8th** so they can be delivered to them in time for their Christmas distribution.
- All gifts cards for **St. Benedict the African** will be accepted up until **Wednesday, January 6th**, the feast of the Epiphany. Two deliveries to St. Benedict will take place: one before Christmas, and one after. St. Benedict prefers to distribute the gift cards through out the year to parishioners in need.

\*\*You'll notice the gifts cards are different for each Sharing Parish. The larger amounts on St. Columbanus replaces the multitude of gifts that have been purchased for each family in the past. The variety of stores and amounts for St. Benedict reflect their needs throughout the entire year (not just at Christmas).

## SAINT OF THE WEEK


#### ST. COLUMBANUS!

We celebrate the feast of St. Coumbanus, also known as Saint Columban, on Monday, November 23rd.

Columban was the greatest of the Irish missionaries who worked on the European continent. As a young man who was greatly tormented by temptations of the flesh, he sought the advice of a religious woman who had lived a hermit's life for years. He saw in her answer a call to leave the world. He went first to a monk on an island in Lough Erne, then to the great monastic seat of learning at Bangor.

After many years of seclusion and prayer, he traveled to Gaul with 12 companion missionaries. They won wide respect for the rigor of their discipline, their preaching, and their commitment to charity and religious life in a time characterized by clerical laxity and civil strife. Columban established several monasteries in Europe which became centers of religion and culture.

Like all saints, he met opposition. Ultimately he had to appeal to the pope against complaints of Frankish bishops, for vindication of his orthodoxy and approval of Irish customs. He reproved the king for his licentious life, insisting that he marry. Since this threatened the power of the queen mother, Columban was deported back to Ireland. His ship ran aground in a storm, and he continued his work in Europe, ultimately arriving in Italy, where he found favor with the king of the Lombards. In his last years he established the famous monastery of Bobbio, where he died. His writings include a treatise on penance and against Arianism, sermons, poetry, and his monastic rule.


