FROM THE PASTOR'S PEN

COME WHAT MAY

Due to a very early bulletin deadline forced upon us by Thanksgiving, I am writing this on November 15. Writing that far in advance means that what you read here is not exactly timely.

Thank goodness we have the daily eblast and can also post up-to-date parish information on our website. The plan, such as it is as I write from the vantage point of mid-November, is for us to be open for Masses and confessions as the new Church year gets underway and as you read this column for the First Sunday of Advent, November 29.

It could be that as Advent rolls around our churches will be shuttered by the coronavirus and state advisories. Who knows? There is no one I know who can read the tea leaves effectively.

What I can tell you is that, come what may, Divine Mercy Parish will continue to minister to people, as best we can and in compliance with whatever state or local restrictions may be enacted.

In the past, our doors have been shut due to circumstances. That didn't mean we stopped ministering. So, for example—

- We livestreamed Mass when we could. We've gotten better at that task with the new technology we've installed. As long as we have priest presiders and technicians to run the equipment, we will continue to livestream.
- Sacred Heart School is educating students. As I write this, the school doors are open. Hopefully, this will continue as we vigorously work to keep kids safe with tons of disinfecting throughout the day, social distancing, the establishment of cohorts, maskwearing, and ventilated classrooms.

Children's Ministry continues. Currently we are engaged in a hybrid of a few in-person gatherings for our public school kids and a whole lot of in-home formation. This is a amazing effort of collaboration between staff, catechists, students and parents.

- Ingenious Pastoral Outreach and Heartfelt Personal Prayer. While we are constrained from visiting in person at most hospitals depending on the current threat level of the coronavirus, we pray with those who are afflicted by various illnesses. Creative efforts are underway to feed the hungry. Coming soon, this spring, we hope to put into place a partnership that will enable us to feed and house families who are temporarily homeless.
- Virtual Ministry takes off. We've got Alpha online on Monday evenings as well as the Virtual Café on Sunday mornings. All of our appointments, whether they are focused on an individual who needs guidance or help, or on couples, for example, for marriage preparation, we do so utilizing Zoom.



DEADLINES:

- We ask that all gift cards for **St. Columbanus** be delivered to Divine Mercy by **Tuesday, December 8th** so they can be delivered to them in time for their Christmas distribution.
- All gifts cards for **St. Benedict the African** will be accepted up until **Wednesday, January 6th**, the feast of the Epiphany. Two deliveries to St. Benedict will take place: one before Christmas, and one after. St. Benedict prefers to distribute the gift cards through out the year to parishioners in need.

**You'll notice the gifts cards are different for each Sharing Parish. The larger amounts on St. Columbanus replaces the multitude of gifts that have been purchased for each family in the past. The variety of stores and amounts for St. Benedict reflect their needs throughout the entire year (not just at Christmas).

SAINT OF THE WEEK

SAINT ANDREW


We celebrate this feast day on Monday, November 30th. Andrew was Saint Peter's brother, and was called with him. "As [Jesus] was walking by the sea of Galilee, he saw two brothers, Simon who is now called Peter, and his brother Andrew, casting a net into the sea; they were fishermen. He said to them, 'Come after me, and I will make you fishers of men.' At once they left their nets and followed him" (Matthew 4:18-20).

John the Evangelist presents Andrew as a disciple of John the Baptist. When Jesus walked by one day, John said, "Behold, the Lamb of God." Andrew and another disciple followed Jesus. "Jesus turned and saw them following him and said to them, 'What are you looking for?' They said to him, 'Rabbi (which translated means Teacher), where are you staying?' He said to them, 'Come, and you will see.' So they went and saw where he was staying, and they stayed with him that day" (John 1:38-39a).

Little else is said about Andrew in the Gospels. Before the multiplication of the loaves, it was Andrew who spoke

up about the boy who had the barley loaves and fishes. When the Gentiles went to see Jesus, they came to Philip, but Philip then had recourse to Andrew.

Legend has it that Andrew preached the Good News in what is now modern Greece and Turkey and was crucified at Patras on an X-shaped cross. *Source: Franciscan Media*




DANCE PARTY! CONGRATULATIONS Sacred Heart for making our Boosterthon goal!! WE ARE AWESOME!!
