

FROM THE PASTOR'S PEN

NEW ENCYCLICAL

Pope Francis recently released a new encyclical letter. This is the highest form of papal teaching, a letter addressed to the all the bishops and to the whole world. His latest is entitled Fratelli Tutti: On Fraternity and Social Friendship.

In the daily posts which I prepare and which lead off the e-blasts sent out to all our subscribers, I am highlighting excerpts from this encyclical from November 9 through 14. They are meant to raise interest in the pope's thinking.

The best way to familiarize yourself with the encyclical is to read the entire letter for yourself. All the papal documents, including this encyclical letter, are available on the website of the Holy See. When you open up the homepage of the Holy See, you'll see the word "Encyclicals." Click on that and choose the language you wish to use in reading *Fratelli Tutti*. Enjoy!

handful of people on Saturday mornings. Since then, that handful has tapered off. We'll keep offering to hear confessions on Saturday mornings. It's nice and quiet in church at that time, very peaceful and conducive to pouring out your heart to God. See you then. Or perhaps I should say, "Hear you, then!"

As a result, we created the **Great Gift Card Challenge**!

We've created a Christmas Sharing page on our website, where you can "sign up" for one or more gift cards that will be distributed to the parishioners of St. Benedict the African and St. Columbanus. Here's what to do next:

DEADLINES:

- We ask that all gift cards for **St. Columbanus** be delivered to Divine Mercy by **Tuesday, December 8th** (one month from today) so they can be delivered to them in time for their Christmas distribution.
- All gifts cards for **St. Benedict the African** will be accepted up until **Wednesday, January 6th**, the feast of the Epiphany. Two deliveries to St. Benedict will take place: one before Christmas, and one after. St. Benedict prefers to distribute the gift cards through out the year to parishioners in need.

**You'll notice the gifts cards are different for each Sharing Parish. The larger amounts on St. Columbanus replaces the multitude of gifts that have been purchased for each family in the past. The variety of stores and amounts for St. Benedict reflect their needs throughout the entire year (not just at Christmas).

What a gift!


