

FROM THE PASTOR'S PEN

OPEN

I bumped into a wonderful parishioner about two weeks ago while shopping for groceries. I had not seen her since March thinking she was being very cautious at not returning to Mass. She was one of those folks who attended Mass every weekend, without fail.

After her surprised greeting we talked a bit. She asked whether or not we had the 10:00 a.m. Mass at Sacred Heart Church up and running. I said yes, the only weekend Mass in the new schedule not yet open for worship is the Sunday evening at 4:30 p.m. at Sacred Heart Church. But, yes, the 10:00 a.m. Mass at Sacred Heart Church is available.

She seemed surprised.

This leads me to wonder if a lot of folks out there either don't get the daily e-blasts, or check our parish website for information, or they do those things but forget. Or is it the remote sign-up that stymies people?

Whatever the reason, I do hope that we have done what we need to do in order to get the word out there. We are open for daily and weekend Masses, albeit, we are operating under a *new* schedule.

Those in the advertising business tell us that if you want people to know something you have to repeat it in various forms for at least 7 times. Perhaps with all our schedules and routines upended by the pandemic we have to double that number and run things past people about 14 times!

SIGNING UP FOR MASS

Just a reminder, in order to attend Mass we need your name and contact information. The sole purpose of this sign-up enables us to contact you in case someone who attended Mass recently contracts COVID19. This way you can quarantine for 14 days or be tested yourselves.

Obviously, this requires that someone who has contracted COVID19 and attended one of our Masses, contacts us to inform us of their status. (And in some cases, we would be contacted by the Illinois Department of Public Health.) We won't give out the infected person's name, but we will tell people who attended the same Mass that someone in the assembly contracted COVID19, and was likely contagious at the time they attended Mass. With the required social distancing and mask wearing, we should be as protected as we can be, short of staying home and having zero contact with anyone.

RESILENT

Thanks for being the resilient people that you are. We are all making the best of it these days. We should all just *keep calm and carry on*.

Meanwhile, we continue to be blessed by wonderfully supportive parishioners who have not stopped pursuing the mission of Christ in the world. We may be engaging in that mission using new and different means, like livestreaming Mass and the daily e-blasts and such, but it is the same mission now and always: to bring the Good News of salvation to all as we continue to make disciples, build Church and serve others.

- **Personal:** Our own, personal encounter with Christ through which we become missionary disciples. #TRY ALPHA!
- **Parish:** Sharing with each other the life we have experienced in encountering Christ. This means taking responsibility for the building up of the parish as a community of faith. We hope to embrace this responsibility through our participation in Alpha. We encourage everyone to attend Alpha, which will help build up our faith and our community.
- Archdiocese: The Cardinal and his staff are responsible for providing vision, resources, and support necessary to lead us to authentic relationship with Christ. They have been a great resource for Divine Mercy Parish.

OUTREACH

SERVING OTHERS

Divine Mercy Parish has a reputation for its generosity and service to others. Thank you for sticking with it through this pandemic! We continue to hear thanks from our many outreach partners, including the New Trier Township Food Pantry, A Just Harvest Community Kitchen, Connections for the Homeless, St. Benedict the African and St. Columbanus, as well as their school Augustus Tolton Catholic Academy. They are so grateful for your help!

We also want to share news from The Women's Center, particularly during this month of October, known as Respect Life Month. The Women's Center has inaugurated The Virtual Baby Bottle Project to raise essential funds for the Women's Center. The Women's Center is dedicated to saving the lives of unborn children threatened by abortion through the most effective, morally acceptable means of reaching, informing and helping their mothers and families with appropriate loving alternatives. The Women's Center also seeks donations to their "Family Room." They are in need of 20 to 40 lb car seats, infant car seat/carriers (by law all car seats must be less than 7 years old), high chairs, strollers, baby carriers, pack n plays, toddler beds, cribs (no drop down sides), exersaucers and baby swings. There is a great need for baby food and all brands of baby formula (especially Enfamil Formula in the yellow box). Also needed are diapers in sizes 4, 5 and 6 only; diaper bags, receiving blankets, new pacifiers, baby wipes, baby shampoo, lotion, and breast pumps. LOOK WHAT'S HAPPENING AT SACRED HEART SCHOOL!




