FROM THE PASTOR'S PEN

THE SEASON TURNS

I have always loved the fall. I don't know if it has to do with my dislike of humidity whose end is signaled by the season's turn and as leaves begin to drop.

Maybe it's the crisp, cool weather. It makes me feel more energized. Or maybe it's the simple fact of change. Change is in the air in the fall. We can see it, that is, change itself, as the leaves turn and drop, as the temperatures go a bit lower.

I think for the most part that change is good. Living beings have to engage in change, in no small part because they are, in fact, living, ongoing. Any living organism must change from time to time. Adaptation is required simply because, for example, circumstances change.

The entire Renew My Church process hinges on the need for change. The world around us has changed greatly. We believers find ourselves in a post-Christian world, a very secular world that in many cases denies God, denies the need for belief, or church, or organized religion. We've all heard the refrain, "I can be spiritual without being a part of the Church" many times.

No one can be spiritual all on their own any more than an individual can get through life well all on their own. Does someone who is "spiritual" invent spirituality all on their own? How did they come up with that concept or the idea that life is more than meets the eye?

We are spiritual beings not just because we are self-aware but because we are aware of the Other, an awareness that has been revealed to us from beyond ourselves. This, in turn, suggests that like any sort of expanded awareness and understanding we need help cultivating that expanded sense. For me, that's reason for the Church.

We are better together than we are

alone. It's in the nature of who we are, made by God for community and, ultimately, Communion. For we are made in the image and likeness of God, a Trinity of divine persons, which is another way of saying "community."

The local Church is experienced in the parishes of the Archdiocese. The way in which parishes have gone about ministry worked in previous eras because those ministerial practices fit with the believing society in which the Church functioned. In our secular times with millions of distractions that keep pulling us away from real community, enticing our heads away from each other and inside our smart phones and tablets, we need to reinvent how parish is done in order to reach people and in order to spread the Good News of Christ.

Change is in the air. At Divine Mercy parish we will continue to pursue evangelization, a welcoming atmosphere, vibrant liturgies, Alpha and



everything and anything else that helps us serve the needs of folks in this modern world of ours. We'll keep the focus on healthy change, one step at a time.

So that we might be effective in making disciples, building Church, and serving others!

WHAT IS ALPHA?



SERVING OTHERS

Divine Mercy Parish has a reputation for its generosity and service to others. Thank you for sticking with it through this pandemic! We continue to hear thanks from our many outreach partners, including the New Trier Township Food Pantry, A Just Harvest Community Kitchen, Connections for the Homeless, St. Benedict the African and St. Columbanus, as well as their school Augustus Tolton Catholic Academy. They are so grateful for your help!

We also want to share news from The Women's Center, particularly during this month of October, known as Respect Life Month. The Women's Center has inaugurated The Virtual Baby Bottle Project to raise essential funds for the Women's Center. The Women's Center is dedicated to saving the lives of unborn children threatened by abortion through the most effective, morally acceptable means of reaching, informing and helping their mothers and families with appropriate loving alternatives. The Women's Center also seeks donations to their "Family Room." They are in need of 20 to 40 lb car seats, infant car seat/carriers (by law all car seats must be less than 7 years old), high chairs, strollers, baby carriers, pack n plays, toddler beds, cribs (no drop down sides), exersaucers and baby swings. There is a great need for baby food and all brands of baby formula (especially Enfamil Formula in the yellow box). Also needed are diapers in sizes 4, 5 and 6 only; diaper bags, receiving blankets, new pacifiers, baby wipes, baby shampoo, lotion, and breast pumps. 

Last Sunday, the 8th graders came together in person for a session — and each brought five hearty sack lunches, which were delivered to Connections for the Homeless in Evanston the next day. Included with their lunches were messages of hope to brighten the day of those in need. Since the pandemic began, Connections for the Homeless has served more than 103,000 meals. Our Confirmation candidates have committed to bringing 150 sack lunches for five months as part of their preparation. We are proud of them.

2nd grade finished their 3D city project...very impressive!


