PASTOR'S "TO THE POINT"



There are a small number of renewal programs in the Catholic world for use in parishes. They are similar in that they all entail a weekend retreat followed by weeks of formation meetings which then build on that initial retreat weekend.

Three such programs that come to mind are *Christ Renews His Parish* (known as CRHP, pronounced "chirp"), *Beloved*, and *Alpha*. By now, you know that *Alpha* is the chosen vehicle that we use in this parish. It differs from the other two in that it begins with a series of sessions that build toward a retreat, and that retreat can be either a day-long one or an entire weekend.

We chose Alpha because it is so "user friendly," so to speak. CRHP and Beloved require very intense work on the part of the team putting those programs together and seeing them through to their conclusions.

The payoff for us as a parish in offering *Alpha* as a formation program and a process for renewal is great. We are seeing its effects in the creation of energy and enthusiasm within the parish, a heightened awareness of the Holy Spirit at work among us, and a kind of forward-looking stance among many who are involved in ministry here.

More people are stepping up and getting involved! For that, we are truly grateful.

In next week's column I will be sharing with you some concrete information on folks' involvement with *Alpha*. It's really interesting stuff. With that teaser, I'll sign off for now.

Today we welcome into our community of faith Susi Leonardson who was baptized in another Christian tradition. We welcome her with the celebration of the Rite of Reception, Bestowal (Giving) of Confirmation and First Eucharist at the 10 a.m. Mass. At this celebration she stands with us and makes the profession of faith as we recite the Nicene Creed. Then she makes a personal profession of faith that she "believes and professes all that the holy Catholic Church believes, teaches, and proclaims to be revealed by God." The presiding priest then accepts this statement and says, "may (you) have full communion with us in the faith that you have professed in the presence of the Lord's family". She then receives the Sacrament Confirmation with the Laying on of Hands, Anointing with Chrism, and a Sign of Welcome. Her First Communion is received during the Liturgy of the Eucharist.

The Easter Duty

The Easter Duty is to receive Holy Communion between Ash Wednesday and Trinity Sunday. Many of us have already done this. Strictly speaking we are only required to receive the Sacrament of Reconciliation if we are conscious of being completely at variance with Our Lord (traditionally called mortal sin). The Church teaches that we should regularly make good acts of contrition and make a Spiritual Communion when unable to receive Communion in person.

A Spiritual Communion Prayer from St Alphonsus: My Jesus, I believe that you are present in the most Holy Sacrament. I love you above all things and I desire to possess you within my soul. Since I cannot now receive you sacramentally, come at least spiritually into my heart. I embrace you as being already there and unite myself wholly to you. never permit me to be separated from you.

LAETARE SUNDAY

The fourth Sunday of Lent is rather unique; like the third Sunday of Advent ("Gaudete Sunday"), the fourth Sunday of Lent is a break in an otherwise penitential season. The vestments for this day can be rose, as they are on Gaudete Sunday in Advent, and flowers may adorn the Altar. This day is called "Laetare Sunday" (also "Rose Sunday"), and takes its name from the opening words of the Mass, the Introit's, or Entrance Antiphon, "Laetare, Jerusalem":

Laetare Jerusalem: et conventum facite omnes qui diligitis eam: gaudete cum laetitia, qui in tristitia fuistis: ut exsultetis, et satiemini ab uberibus consolationis vestrae. (Psalm) Laetatus sum in his, quae dicta sunt mihi: in domum Domini ibimus. Gloria Patri...

Rejoice, O Jerusalem: and come together all you that love her: rejoice with joy, you that have been in sorrow: that you may exult, and be filled from the breasts of your consolation. cf. Isaiah 55: Verse: I rejoiced at the things that were said to me: we shall go into the house of the Lord. (Psalm 122:1) Glory to the Father ...

We are now past the halfway point of Lent. How are your Lenten practices going? Did you know it's not too late to start? Indeed, the message of today's liturgy is just that—"God so loved the world that he gave his only Son." If God's love is so great, it's even enough for those of us who got a late start on Lent. It's never too late to turn to the Lord.

Even during Lent, we remain a joyful people, for we believe that God loves us despite our sinfulness, loves us so much that Jesus Christ sacrificed himself so that we may be redeemed and born into eternal life. Today on Laetare ("Rejoice") Sunday, we anticipate the joy we will feel on Easter. Let us give thanks to God for the grace and mercy we have regularly received and trust we will continue to receive throughout our lives.


