PALM SUNDAY OF THE PASSION OF THE LORD

PASTOR'S "TO THE POINT"



Holy Week begins. We enter the holiest of weeks with the Lord Jesus. In this week, we commemorate Christ's royal entrance into Jerusalem and the saving work he accomplishes on our behalf as he suffers, dies and is raised up.

During this most Holy Week, I wanted to share a **letter from your future Pastor, Fr. Dan Folwaczny.**

Dear Divine Mercy Parish and Sacred Heart School,

"Jesus, I trust in you!" In truth I must tell you that my appointment as your next pastor was very sudden and unexpected for me, and I have found myself often repeating these words of Sister Faustina over the last few days. Jesus, I trust in you!

I am a little familiar with your parish and all that you have accomplished over the last few years. I was ordained as a priest in 2014, and my first assignment was at St. Norbert and Our Lady of the Brook in Northbrook. I was blessed to serve as the associate pastor to Fr. Bob Heinz, and to get to know Fr. Larry Dunn, who lived with us. Occasionally I would help with confessions or Masses at your parish as well. I know that you should be proud of your role in leading the way with Renew My Church, with Alpha, and with evangelization.

Since July of 2020 I have been privileged to serve as the pastor of what we now call Our Lady of the Blessed Sacrament Parish in Elk Grove Village, the union of the former Queen of the Rosary and St. Julian Eymard parishes. Through the challenge of the pandemic, we worked to bring our two communities together and build a new identity. Our staff and parish pastoral council have been trying to create new ways to increase our presence in the village and to respond to the developing needs that we see. We have also been hard at work renewing and celebrating our Queen of the Rosary School, which just marked its 65th anniversary.

As Catholics we recently celebrated the solemnity of the Annunciation and we honored the ready obedience of Mary, even though she did not understand the message that the angel brought to her. In accepting this new appointment as your pastor, I renew my own "yes" to the Lord. It is also a "yes" to all of you.

In the meantime, there is still much work to be accomplished where I am now. Although I look forward to joining together with you on our journey of discipleship, it is only right that I keep my present focus here in Elk Grove Village, and for you to celebrate and honor the time that you have had with Fr. Steve Lanza. I am grateful for his welcome to me and for our communication over this last week, so we can ensure a smooth transition.

There will be time for more introductions as we get closer to July. Please pray for me and know that I am praying for all of you. Let us now keep our hearts fixed on the Easter mystery that we are about to celebrate. The Lord has done great things for us, and He calls us forward into an ever more abundant life.

INTRODUCTION TO THE LITURGY

We begin the holiest week of the year by holding palm branches in our hands, which recall the palm branches the crowds used two thousand years ago to welcome the Lord into the holy city. Our palm branches are blessed, for they also welcome the Lord to this holy place. Though the people of Jerusalem had no idea what the true nature of Jesus' triumph would soon be, we do and so we anticipate Jesus' ultimate victory while recognizing the intense suffering and profound grief that will accompany it. Let us raise our voices along with our branches as we sing out as even the stones will, "Blessed is the king who comes in the name of the Lord!"

OUR OFFERINGS IN SUPPORT OF THE MISSION OF THE CHURCH

After Mass continue celebrating Palm Sunday by displaying your palm in your home to remember Jesus' sacrifice. Place it on a mantle, above a doorway, on or behind the frame of a holy picture or statue, so you can see it every day. Next year return your palm to the church so it can be burned to make ashes for Ash Wednesday. Blessed palms should not be put in normal trash.

**FIRST READING**

The Suffering Servant speaks to the weary.

Isaiah 50:4-7

Chapters 40-55 of the Book of Isaiah contain the message of a prophet who spoke to God's people during their exile in Babylon. Several times the prophet speaks about a servant who will one day deliver God's people. Because the Servant is portrayed as suffering, Christians have traditionally identified Jesus with him.

RESPONSORIAL PSALM

My God, why have abandoned me?

Psalms 22:8-9, 17-18, 19-20, 23-24

Today's psalm is a glimpse into the mind of Jesus headed to Calvary. In between a declaration of abandonment is the narrative of someone who continues to rely on the Lord. The refrain is one of anguish, but the verses are steadfast in trust.

SECOND READING

Jesus emptied himself, and God filled this emptiness with exaltation.

Philippians 2:6-11

In the years following Christ's death and resurrection, Christians began to develop the prayers and hymns that would become part of their rituals. In today's passage from the letter to the Philippians, Paul appears to be quoting an early Christian hymn celebrating the dying and rising of Christ.

GOSPEL PROCLAMATION

Luke 23:1-49

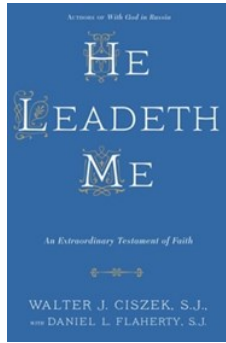
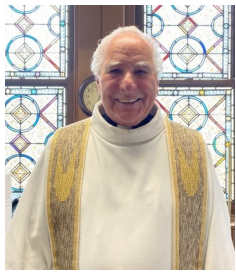
All of our own sufferings are wrapped up in the passion of Christ. His suffering was not in vain but rather became the source of abundant life for us. So our suffering, too, can be joined to Christ's.

In ancient times, palm branches **symbolized goodness and victory**. They were often depicted on coins and important buildings. Solomon had palm branches carved into the walls and doors of the temple. Again at the end of the Bible, people from every nation raise palm branches to honor Jesus.

Pussy willow branches are used on Palm Sunday in regions where palm trees don't grow, like parts of Europe, primarily because they are one of the first plants to bloom in the spring, symbolizing new life and thus acting as a suitable substitute for the palm branches used for Jesus' entry into Jerusalem, representing the coming of the Messiah; this is especially prevalent in Polish and other Slavic cultures where the pussy willow holds significant symbolic meaning.

How is the date of Easter determined?

The date for Easter is set by the rising of the full moon on or after the Spring Equinox which was on March 20. This year the spring full Moon rises on the night of Saturday, April 12, last night.

Traditionally called the Paschal Full Moon, it signals the traditional start of the Sacred Paschal Triduum at sundown Thursday, April 17, the summit of the Liturgical Year. Though chronologically three days, they are liturgically one day unfolding for us the unity of Christ's Paschal Mystery. The single celebration of the Triduum marks the end of the Lenten season, and leads to the Mass of the Resurrection of the Lord at the Easter Vigil.

What Is I.N.R.I. on the Crucifix?

Above the crucifix at St. Philip the Apostle Church you notice the letters INRI. This is an abbreviation for *Jesus Nazarenus, Rex Judeorum* — Jesus of Nazareth, King of the Jews. In Latin the "I" and "J" are usually interchangeable and ancient Latin did not use the "J." That is why it is I.N.R.I. not J.N.R.J. It was common for the Romans to hang a "titulus" or sign above the crucified to indicate the charges against him.

Scripture says that Pilate put the charges in Latin, Greek and Hebrew. Pilate placed this title above Jesus in scorn and mockery, rather than faith. He also likely knew it would irritate the Jewish leaders, which it did (see Jn 19:21).

Yet even in his ridicule, Pilate spoke truth. Jesus is King, not of the Jews only, but of all things.

Did you know? A plenary indulgence is granted to the faithful who piously recite or sing the verses of the *Tantum ergo* after the Mass of the Lord's Supper on Holy Thursday during the solemn reposition of the Most Blessed Sacrament.

A plenary indulgence is granted to the faithful, who in the solemn liturgical action of Good Friday devoutly assist at the Adoration of the Cross.

A plenary indulgence is granted to the faithful who, at the celebration of the Easter Vigil, renew their baptismal vows.

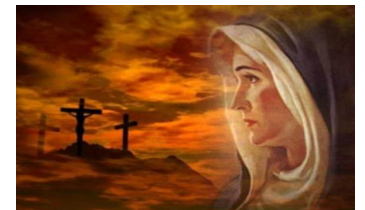
