FROM THE PASTOR'S PEN

WHAT DO YOU WANT FIRST?

I'm sure you must have had conversations with others where it began, "I have news for you; which do you want to hear first, the bad news or the good news?" We've all been there, right?

So I have news for you. I'll give you the bad news first, followed by the good news. The bad news is that our livestream of the Saturday evening Mass this past weekend never got out there into peoples' homes. All right, it got there, but everyone saw, for the most part, the "circle of death," the buffering circle. That was that. Not much more. The good news is that our livestream of the Sunday morning 10:00 Mass, which was our latest addition to the weekend schedule, did get out there; it worked and you were able to participate virtually.

Why one worked and the other didn't is, as of this writing, a mystery. What I can tell you is that we have staff members and our outside vendor working on this issue to resolve it.

As everyone says, when technology works, it really helps us. When it doesn't, it's a pain.

We'll eventually get there. Like so many things during this pandemic, we're learning and adapting and trying to move forward. Sometimes it seems as if it's two steps forward and one back. Nevertheless, in the main, we're getting there. Thanks for your patience and your understanding.

MORE GOOD NEWS

As I mentioned above, we added the Sunday 10:00 Mass to the weekend schedule. It's being celebrated at Sacred Heart Church.

We were almost at full capacity at all our other Masses. This leads me to believe that maybe we ought to open up for the Sunday evening Mass at 4:30 p.m. in the near future.

To do so, we will need more volunteers to step forward to help out with greeting and directing people in order to comply with the safety requirements during the pandemic. What's really cool is that we have a number of new parishioners who have recently joined the parish and two households have come forward among these new parishioners to volunteer their services as greeters and ushers during the pandemic. This is a lovely sign of hope for us.

I don't know that our growth as a parish will ever come in a dramatic fashion. It's more likely that growth will proceed in a slow, steady pace. At least, that's my hope. I'd rather have the slow and steady as opposed to the "flash in the pan" growth that is sudden and dramatic but then peters out.

Alpha will continue to be a mainstay of this effort toward growth. The newest *Alpha* begins tomorrow night. If you know of someone who will benefit from *Alpha*, the best way to get them involved in it is to make a **personal invitation** to them, including an offer to attend with them to accompany them—if that makes them more receptive to it. Here are some tips in inviting someone to participate in *Alpha*—

1) Pray

Pray about who to invite. Make a list of those who come to mind. Then, over time, casually mention your own experience and excitement about *Alpha* with them.

2) Come and See

The message to share with others: *Alpha is for everyone.* There's no pressure to attend or follow up. Come to the Launch Night and see what you think.

Why are we running it? So people can ask the BIG questions of life, to share the Gospel and introduce people to Jesus.



If someone asks why they should go?

Respond: "Why not? Give it a chance."

3) Don't make the ask too big

The prospect of joining an eleven session course can sound pretty daunting to anyone—the time commitment alone can put-off potential guests. But by asking guests to simply give it a try and then make up their mind, the invitation to Alpha suddenly becomes less intimidating for both the invited and the invitee.

4) Be OK with 'No'

One of the biggest challenges is overcoming our fears of rejection. "If I ask my friend and they say 'No,' what do I say after that?" While this initial rejection can be enough to stop us from asking again, a helpful response is "Maybe next time," or "we are going to run it again, let me know if ever you're interested." A "No" isn't the end of the world.

So if you've attended Alpha, think about who you can invite. ... today. And if you've never tried Alpha, Come and See!

MEN'S RETREAT: OCT 9-11th The Beatitudes: Turning Challenges Into Blessings

If you're interested in attending this Men's Retreat, scheduled for October 9th - 11th, it's imperative you make reservations as soon as possible. Why? Under normal circumstances there would be 70-80 retreatants on a weekend at Bellarmine Hall. They now limit it to 37 retreatants in order to maintain social distancing. A \$100 deposit will secure your place on the retreat.

Masks are required, but may be removed when in your private room or while alone outdoors. Cleaning by their staff takes place not just at the end of each retreat, but also in the middle of the weekend to minimize risk. Meals are served in place by staff rather than self-serve.

Each retreatant has a private room, and the meals are wonderful. There is plenty of time for private prayer, meditation and consultation with spiritual directors, as well as multiple opportunities to receive the Sacrament of Reconciliation.

SERVING OTHERS

St. Paul tells us in his letter to the faith community in Philippi that we are to "do nothing out of selfishness or out of vainglory; rather, humbly regard others as more important than yourselves, each looking out not for his own interests, but also for those of others." (Philippians 2: 3-4)

Divine Mercy Parish has a reputation for its generosity and service to others. And your generosity flowed even during the pandemic. Donations to the **New Trier Food Pantry** continued to flow. Thousands of school supplies were donated by parishioners, to help the students at **St. Columbanus' school, Augustus Tolton Catholic Academy**, as were donations for school uniforms. Because of you, we are able to fund our monthly meal for **A Just Harvest Community Kitchen** in Rogers Park through March with help from Three Tarts Bakery in Northfield!

Our **Love Your Neighbor Program**, which began in March with the pandemic, allowed parishioners to reach out to other parishioners who were elderly or living alone, and might need a hand or a friendly voice on the other end of the telephone. This program was so successful that the Archdiocese is adopting a similar program for parishes around the city.

Our Children's Ministry program will undertake a service program this year to help **Connections for the Homeless** in Evanston provide meals for those people who are struggling and living on the streets.

October is Respect Life Month and The Women's Center has inaugurated *The Virtual Baby Bottle Project* to raise essential funds for the Women's Center. The Women's Center is dedicated to saving the lives of unborn children threatened by abortion through the most effective, morally acceptable means of reaching, informing and helping their mothers and families with appropriate loving alternatives. You can visit www.gotwc.org to learn more about the organization or to make a donation. The Women's Center also seeks donations to their "Family Room." They are in need of 20 to 40 lb car seats, infant car seat/carriers (by law all car seats must be less than 7 years old), high chairs, strollers, baby carriers, pack n plays, toddler beds, cribs (no drop down sides), exersaucers and baby swings. There is a great need for baby food and all brands of baby formula (especially Enfamil Formula in the yellow box). All baby food must be in date. Also needed are diapers in sizes 4, 5 and 6 only; diaper bags, receiving blankets, new pacifiers, baby wipes, baby shampoo, lotion, and breast pumps. These items cannot be picked up unless accompanied by baby furniture. The families who receive them are grateful for your generosity. For more information, please call 773-794-1313.

House of the Good Shepherd is a sanctuary for women and children who are survivors of domestic violence and abuse. It is a safe place where they are offered love, compassion, and respect. You can read more about this wonderful organization on their Facebook page [here](#) and learn how to help. There are many ways to help them rebuild lives. Financially, \$125 pays for a GED exam fee for one mother; \$330 pays for 12 sessions of economic independence classes for mothers. \$1200 funds six aftercare sessions where former residents receive support to maintain a violence-free life. The mothers, children, Board and staff of the House of Good Shepherd are so grateful for your support!

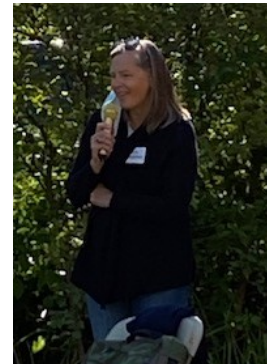

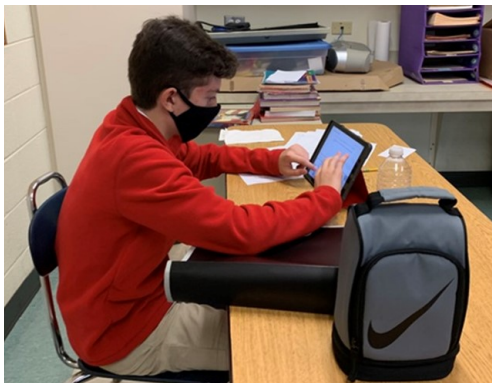

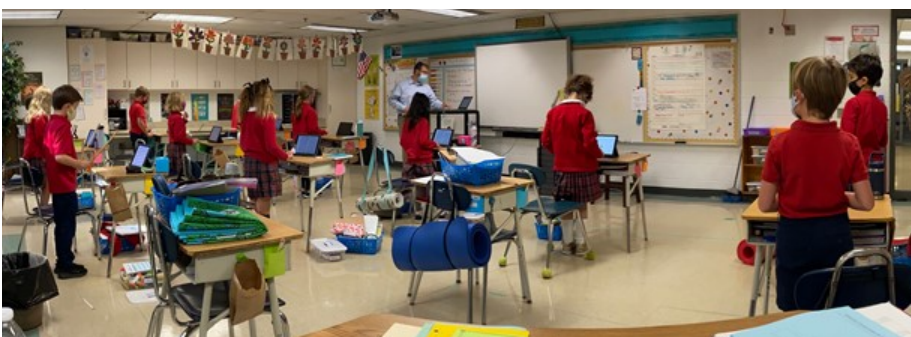
LOOK WHAT'S HAPPENING AT SACRED HEART SCHOOL!

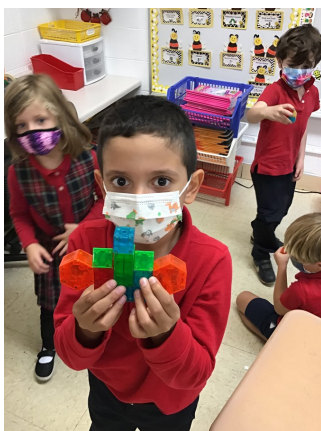
The 7th graders are studying population ecology. They went outside to graph their data.
