"The old order has passed away." That's a quote from the Book of Revelation, chapter 21 verse 4. How telling for the situation in which we find ourselves today. Much of the world finds itself sheltering at home and/or in quarantine. In recognition of this reality, Pope Francis has called for all Christians throughout the world to join in praying the Our Father on **Wednesday, March 25, 2020, at NOON** (the feast of the Annunciation).

FRIDAY PRAYER SERVICE AT NOON

In addition, the Pope announced that on **Friday, Marcy 27th at 6:00 p.m. Rome time (Noon CST)**, he will preside at a prayer service from the front of St. Peter's Basilica, before the empty square. He has invited everyone to participate spiritually from afar. This prayer service will consist of readings from Scripture, prayers of petition and adoration of the Blessed Sacrament. The prayer service will conclude with the *Urbi et orbi Blessing* (the Blessing to the city of Rome and the world), which only is typically offered on solemn occasions such as Christmas and Easter. The prayer service will be broadcast live from the Vatican.
